purpose. Marwood then stepped to the right, pulled a lever, and released the drop. The prisoner fell a distance of nine feet, and death apparently was instantaneous. When the drop fell the chaplain was uttering the sentence, 'Lord, have mercy upon us' and he concluded with the word 'Amen' just as the body disappeared from view into the pit below.

THE INQUEST.

The body having remained hanging an hour was cut down in the presence of the governor and prison officials, and at a quarter past ten o'clock an inquest was held in the committee-room, before Mr W E Baxter, one of the coroners for Sussex. There had been a great desire on the part of the public to perform the duties of jurymen on this particular occasion, and over fifty applications had been received. The jury having viewed the body, and the prison officials and the surgeon having given their evidence, the coroner read over the statutory verdict, that the body they had viewed was proved to be that of Percy Leffroy Mapleton, alias Arthur Leffroy, and that judgment of death had been duly executed and carried into effect. That the jury agreed to the verdict, and the proceedings terminated.

The body was subsequently buried within the precincts of the prison, and the small number of persons who remained about until the last quietly dispersed.

Percy Leffroy Mapleton was the son of the late Captain Mapleton, who at the time of his marriage in 1843 was a Master in the Royal Navy. By the influence of his father-in-law, Mr. William Seale, then secretary to St. Helens, Captain Mapleton was offered and he accepted the position as summary judge at that island, an appointment created for him. He afterwards rose to the rank of staff-commander, and in 1860 he was asked to resign his post, according to the statement of one of his daughters, in consequence of mental incapacity. Prior to that date, it is stated that for some years he had been subjected to hallucinations and to fits of mental delusion; and on one occasion attempted to commit suicide. His condition of mind was a source of great trouble to his wife, who, previous to the birth of Leffroy, was subject to intense melancholy, which was followed by a severe attack of brain fever. The forced resignation by her husband of his lucrative appointment, which occurred a very short time before her child was born, preyed upon her mind considerably. Captain Mapleton was 54 years of age when his son was born; he died two years ago at the age of 74, from softening of the brain. Leffroy's mother died when he was six years old, and the care of the family devolved upon his sister, whose death occurred about 12 months since. Leffroy was educated partly at home, and when a mere youth was allowed to enter into some theatrical speculations. A correspondent of a morning paper has stated that he was the new Minister of War that he has the new lighthouse now all right, on the tip top of Monte Hermoso, and all the wants to set it going is Colza oil and a big wick, neither of which is his companions. He was always weak and delicate. As he grew older, he associated himself with members of the theatrical profession, and it was believed by many that he contrived theatrical notices to certain papers devoted to the profession. Another newspaper correspondent who knew Leffroy, states that he was born abroad, but it has been asserted that he was born in the neighbourhood of London. The name Leffroy, it is said, was given to him out of respect for a brother officer, to whom his father was greatly attached. Some theatrical speculations in which he was engaged ended disastrously, and he was sent off to Australia. He had been there four months only when a telegram was received from him stating that he had broken his arm, which was untrue. His return passage was paid out of a sum of £200 to which he would become entitled, and he came back to England about 18 months since. His elder sister states that Leffroy called upon her in January last, when he expressed a fear that the police were looking for him, and she was alarmed to hear him ask whether she did not see some one following him. On the same occasion he narrated an improbable tale treating of an engagement he alleged to have procured for some one whose references he feared would prove fictitious, and he stated that he should journey to Southend to see whether they were so or not. As it turned out, there was not a shadow of foundation for this representation. Since his incarceration at Lewes, the prisoner has entertained similar fancies, and two or three days before his trial he telegraphed saying that a gentleman in the south of England had guaranteed £100 towards the legal expenses. This assertion, it transpired, was altogether groundless. In describing his flight from Wallington, he stated that he walked to Islington and saw his sister, and on the following night stayed at a house in the Strand.

Until latterly little has been done in this country to encourage the study of English amongst Argentines; it is true that it is taught in some of the city schools, and is supposed to be taught in the National Colleges, but few of our youths, after their college course, are able even to translate it, much less to speak it. This can be attributed only to a want of good teaching-method, for surely the Argentine student is by no means duller of comprehension than the European.

Even in England up to the last twenty years, the teaching of modern languages was greatly neglected. We all remember the trouble it gave us to scramble through French grammar, some pages of Lemachus or Latouche's fables, a few of us left school with little more than a smattering of any foreign language. We were crammed with Virgil and Homer, but could make a very poor attempt at translating a French or German newspaper; we could point out with accuracy the characteristics of the German dialects, but would have had to keep up the most common-place conversation in any language our own.

To the Germans belong the method of working a radical change in the art of teaching; they have the dignity of a profession, given importance to a career which was not properly appreciated.

Now, there are two methods, mostly in vogue with teachers of modern languages—the right and the wrong—one—the analytical, and the synthetical.

Translation into the native tongue, the learning of words from the needful discourse, the study of great writers and the discovery of grammatical principles by means of the language, are examples of the analytical process. Translation into the native tongue, the learning of words from the connected discourse, the study of foreign writers and the discovery of grammatical principles by induction from the language, are examples of the analytical process. The learning of words, definitions and rules of grammar are examples of the synthetical process. The former is also called the method of invention, and is recommended by modern pedagogues; the latter is the method of doctrine, and is still used by 'old hands.'

It is a great mistake to begin the study of a modern language by a course of grammatical technology, which has little to do with the import of words. We may know a number of rules by heart, and be still completely in the dark with regard to the true meaning of words and sentences.

We have before us a little work styled "Curso-Elemental del idioma Inglés," by Professor William A. Fitzsimon, Vice-Rector of the National College at Corrientes, with which the author proposes to teach our language to Argentines by means of the analytical method.

We have carefully revised Mr. Fitzsimon's work, and we may safely recommend it to teachers and schools. The subject matter is presented in a most logical order, and it is quite evident that the author is a teacher in the modern acceptance of the term.

As its title indicates, the book is not meant to be a complete course: it is intended for beginners. It does not fatigue the student by loading his memory with the rules of a language which he does not yet understand, and in this respect the author closely follows the method of Robertson. The "Curso-Elemental" is concise and yet very comprehensive; it omits nothing that is essential, and does not contain anything superfluous.

The book is divided into four parts. The first part contains easy phrases, in which each word is accompanied by its meaning in Spanish. The second consists of a series of simple reading lessons, in which the student meets with all the words he has learned in the first division. The third section contains plenty of translation exercises, in prose and verse, arranged progressively; and in the fourth part we have a concise synopsis of the English language, in which the pupil can be drilled in the use of the different parts of speech and in the conjugation of verbs.

Mr. Fitzsimon is a professor of long standing in the country, and for the last twelve years has been in the employment of the National Government, as Vice-Rector of the College of Corrientes,

We are glad to see our countryman holding a post of such trust and honour, and heartily congratulate the author of the "Curso-Elemental del idioma Inglés."

LATEST FROM BRAZIL

Their SS. HH., the Princess Imperial and Comte d'Eu, with their children, arrived on the morning of the 10th and proceeded at once to Petropolis.

Mr. Thomas Osborne, United States Minister here, arrived on the same day.

Senator Florencio Carlos de Abreu e Silva, President of the Province of São Paulo, died in Rio on the 12th, after an illness of some duration. The deceased was a distinguished member of the Liberal party and represented in the Senate his native province Rio Grande do Sul.

In consequence of the reclamations of the soap boilers against the Custom House levy of the highest rates on resin upon light-coloured resins, a decree of the 9th puts into provisional execution a new classification by which prepared resin for instruments is taxed 800 reis per kilogram and resin and pitch 500 reis per kilogram, and every other quality 5 reis per kilogram.
