THE INDIGNATION MEETING.

Indignation meetings in this city are

not usual, and we believe Sunay's effort was about the first attempt of the kind since the days of Rivadavia. The public of Buenos Aires is imbued with such a high sense of prudence, and we may add, respectability, that indignation, although oftentimes individually felt, is never collectively expressed.

Whether a vice or a virtue, we must all confess to a large share of indifference than most publics. To say that the meeting in question was a failure would be an error, since the theatre was tolerably well filled and the commemorative resolutions were unanimously passed; but the whole affair passed off so quietly, the speeches were so tame, and the absence of many of our most prominent politicians so remarkable, that whatever may be the private indignation of the citizens at the murder of Senator Gomez, their public condemnation of the crime lacks that wild enthusiasm of expression which we all looked for, and all expected at such a meeting.

Dr. del Valle took the chair and called the meeting to business. In his usual eloquent style he explained what they had assembled for, and was much applauded. Still his discourse was too short for an incentive, and lacked both solemnity and fire to lift the roof. Sr. A. B. Sarmiento, who acted as nephew of the great Sarmiento, read his uncle's telegrams and the resolutions. Dr. Leandro Alen, notwithstanding his weak health, made a very good speech, quiet, orderly and to the point, and Dr. Achaval, editor of the *Ushuaia*, threw a grain of salt into the affair by lifting the coffin lid and throwing the blame of the whole business on the Mitristas.

There is not much to add, save that at 1 past 3 o'clock the meeting was dissolved and its record passed into history. The occasion was certainly one for S. Danton or Mirabeau, but we have none amongst us. Verily we believe, had the meeting been called to protest against the cento tramway fare, there would have been more life and spirit in the proceedings—but many circumstances conspired against the success of the movement. Dr. Ave-Llanos was sick in bed—old Sarmiento was away in Chile, Dr. J. C. Gomez

was also unable to attend, the Lord Mayor had given the movement no countenance. It was Sunday and in Summer, and few allowed their indignation to bring them in from the quinta and suburbs to be tried alive in a hot theatre. The slave who murdered Senator Gomez was neither cursed nor apostrophised, as he should have been. The old Greeks beat us hollow in their indignation at political murder. Gomez has persisted and we are all indignant; but there is no mistaking the fact that much of the moral indignation expressed is flavored with politeness, and to measure our just indignation at so great a crime by the contractors the amount that would be paid for the gas lamps that are replaced by the electric light.

Buenos Aires, Feb. 17th 1884.

Interpreting the sentiments of the nation at large, in honour of Argentinian civilization, and in defence of the dignity of the political parties of the country, the inhabitants of the Capital of the Republics in public meeting this day assembled to express indignation at the murder of Lt. Colonel A. Gomez, National Senator for San Juan, and the attempted murder of Dr. Gil, Governor of the province, and of Dr. Donzel and Mallo, Governor and Vice-Governor elect, declaratory in the face of the nation.—

1st—Political assassination is an atrocious crime that should be exterminated as a weapon in party warfare.

2nd—Assassination can never be a purely political crime, and political murderers, their instigators and abettors, should be tried as ordinary criminals.

3rd—The national dignity, social tranquility and the future of our institutions imperiously demand that political murder be anathematized and punished in the severest manner.

4th—In accordance with these principles, the citizens assembled at this meeting do condemn and execrate the horrible crime perpetrated on the person of Senator Gomez, on the 6th inst., and ask all inhabitants of the republic, native and foreign, to unite with us in demanding the punishment of the criminals. And we hereby resolve—that these declarations be published in the newspapers of the Capital and of the whole republic; that they be communicated to the Government of San Juan, and also to the Gomez family with a sincere expression of our confidence.

The Secretary had 20 carriages at the door, and they were soon occupied by the members of the Argentine Delegation who were at D'Amico's house where the Governor-elect and his wife, Dr. Cardoso and Mrs. D'Amico, had the hours at a nice lunch. Mr. Urioste read a short speech, and Mr. Meyer read another, congratulating the Governor-elect, and promising to give H. E. a grand banquet. The whole "posse comitatus" then took leave of Dr. Cardoso and drove to Dr. Cardoso's house, where another lunch disappeared and the speeches were read over again. The Electors then went home.

At two o'clock on Sunday the electors began to arrive at the Government House, but the Provisional President, Don Carlos Urioste, did not take his seat till 3 p.m., when business began.

The minutes of the previous session were read, the President and Secretary were re-elected, and then each Elector handed in a card to the Secretary with his vote. All the votes were for Dr. D'Amico as Governor, and Dr. Mat. Cardoso as Vice-Governor. Mossa, Molina, Lamas, Madero, and Martinez were named Scrutinizers. In a quarter of an hour their onerous work was all over, the result was proclaimed, and all went off to congratulate the elected.
