THE MONTEVIDEO PORT.

At last we can announce that the Montevideo Port scheme is settled. A scheme that has occupied public attention on both sides of the Plate for the last 10 or 12 years, and which like all great measures has met with an opposition more political than anything else.

We have already on many occasions published the principal heads of this scheme. The entire work will be undertaken cost about fifteen millions Montevidean gold dollars, which is something over three millions sterling, and when we consider that fully three quarters of that large sum has to be spent in Montevideo, we can see at a glance how much the Montevidean market will be benefited by the enterprise.


