SECOND RING..... 203.70% The threatening news from Europe swept over the Bolsa to-day like a bullsh blast and put up the price of gold. The speculation during the morning was active and feverish, and at one moment the cash supply threatened to run short. There can be no doubt that the critical state of politics in the North and the sudden snag-up in the Chilian negotiations here warrant the greatest caution, and bankers and merchants are "going slow"

for the moment, waiting for eventualities. All the circumstances that favored a fall in gold are jeopardised by unforeseen events. Should a rupture of relations ensue between Spain and the United States, should the Chilian negotiations be broken off, should fresh an efficience accounts. broken off, should fresh suspicious cases of fever take place, the falling tendency of gold would be an anachronism.

Over one million gold dollars changed hands at the first ring. Business for cash embraced four hundred thousand dollars; premium opened at 201.80%, rose to %, and closed hard at 203%. Sales or the end of the month amounted also to four hundred thousand dollars; the premium opened at 205%, rose to 207.50%, and closed at 206-three points contango. Over one hundred thousand dollars were sold for Saturday at more or less same rates as for cash. An equal amount was sold for the settlement of the 15th, the premium closing at 204%.
