Why do they not borrow a little more of the common sense, as they did their forms of government from the great Republic of the North, which has no official national hymn, and which allows any one to hang out any and as many flags as he pleases? Until a few years ago on St. Patrick's Day in the morning the Irish flag waved above the City Hall in New York. The practice was stopped, not by the National Government, but by a Mayor who was averse to the proceeding. The mass of the citizens had never objected.

THE SANTA CRUZ RAILWAY.

The proposed extension of the Strawberry railway to Santa Cruz is again on the tapis, over a proposal of a leading European banking firm to facilitate all the funds necessary. It is said that Dr. Quirno Costa thanked the firm for the offer, but will apply to Congress for an appropriation to make the preliminary surveys, after which the construction will be considered. The question opens up two points for discussion; first, is the line an urgent necessity; secondly, whether it would not be more advisable to leave the usiness to private enterprise. That the Strawberry railway will eventually terminate in the farthest south point of Argentine territory is a foregone conclusion, but this is not the work of a day, nor, with an accessible coast line, is the urgency at all apparent. What is abolutely pressing is the necessity or a good packet service to southern ports, and the opening up on proper lines of the naviga-tion of the Rio Negro. "Festina lente" s an excellent motto. Let the Government, herefore, go slow on the Santa Cruz line, and attend rather to the more pressing needs. The Rio Negro Salt Company has made an "ad referendum" contract with dovernment, which if only helped on and pushed through, will do all that is reuired for the valley, giving it steady and fairly rapid means of communication, as well as free access to an ocean port. This of course is private enterprise, and perhaps it would be just as well to leave the Santa Cruz line also to private capital, which is never slow or chary in coming forward for such things. Eb. Note.—In the above table all figures of quantity and number are official, from the Custom House and Statistical Department of the Nation. All figures of value are also official, except those for the second quarter of this year which are reckoned at market quotations.

The uniformity in some monthly exports arises from the fact that we compute the monthly average of exports per quarter, as owing to distances and delays in means of communication, it is impossible to get the exact figures each mont h—the figures per quarter are exact. In the same fashion we have computed the official values per monthly average of each quarter.

The quantities are expressed in tons of 1,000 kilograms, say 2,200 English pounds.

The above, being official quantities and numbers and official values, are the only reliable figures that can be supplied, and are the most approximately correct.

The figures of export of live-stock for first quarter of 1897, for 1896 and previous years include animals sent across frontier to Uruguay, Paraguay, Chile and Bolivia, whilst the figures for second quarter of 1897, are limited to shipments of live-stock by steamer beyond capes.
