A SOCIETY PRESS TELEGRAMS

HATAS AGENCY

Madrid, 7th.  
The news from all parts is dreadful. Business is at a complete standstill. Most of the principal factories are closed, which increases the difficulties.

Marseilles, 7th.

Fifty-three deaths from cholera.  
Marseilles, 8th.

Twenty-six deaths in the last 24 hours.

Berlin, 7th.

The Emperor of Austria started to-day for Gastein to visit the Emperor of Germany.

The interview was most cordial. No political question was even mooted.

New York, 7th.

Deputations from all parts continue to arrive, to attend General Grant's funeral to-morrow, which will be the most pompous affair ever witnessed in the United States.

Paris, 8th.

The Legislative election will take place on the 4th October next.

## PRESS TELEGRAMS.

Madrid 6th.—Yesterday there were 4294 fresh cases of cholera in Spain and 1638 deaths.

The rapid spreading of cholera has caused great alarm. Several infected districts are entirely deserted and abandoned even by the Municipal authorities. In many cases the dead bodies have remained several days without burial. It is moreover stated that not unfrequently the inhabitants have been unable to obtain provisions and medicine. The greatest misery prevails.

Marseilles 6th.—The Board of Health of this city have telegraphed to the Minister of the Interior, stating that the cases of cholera that have occurred prove that the disease is merely sporadic. It is believed that this telegram is intended to hide the alarm of the Board of Health, to whose inactivity is due the reappearance of the epidemic.

Paris 6th.—Government has decreed a sum of frs. 600,000 to meet the requirements of the sanitary system in Marseilles.

Moscow 6th.—It is stated that Russia has decided to definitely arrange the pending difficulties in Central Asia. The present negotiations with England are not very important for the present moment.

Berlin 6th.—The *Cologne Zeitung* publishes an article, resembling that of the *N. A. Zeitung*, in which it is stated France is incurring great danger, in pursuing her present policy with regard to Germany.

Paris 6th.—The papers still continue to censure the articles in the Berlin and Cologne papers alluding to the hostile attitude of France. It is stated that this will furnish an excuse for Germany to augment her military forces.

Chicago 6th.—Vice-President Hendricks and his wife have arrived here on their journey to assist at General Grant's funeral.

Washington, 6th.—The Austrian Minister of Foreign Affairs has telegraphed to the United States Government, that this government declines to receive Mr. Kelly as American Minister. No reason is open for this strange conduct.

They beat him, danced on his official head piece, took his official weapon from him, pitched him headlong into a slimy ditch, and then marched home to bed, singing "I sergrato per esser felice."

The City Improvement Commissioners have taken a leaf out of Dr Pachico's book, and rejected 40,000 barrels of Portland Cement because the terms asked were too onerous. Dr Garcia, Argentine Minister in London, has been ordered to buy the article there. This turning of Ministers Plenipotentiary into brokers and hagmen is really most "fra dig." Just fancy Sir Edward Thornton getting an order to buy a lot of Russian tallow; or our Minister at the Hague one for red herrings or round cheeses!

A big game hall is "on" to-day at the alley in Calle Moreno. All the fast men and boys in town will be there, as ball-playing is now "the correct thing."

There must be an enormous amount of city taxes uncollected. Every day in the week we see a petition to the Lord Mayor from Don Somebody or other to be appointed "recaudador de impuestos strazados."

It is well to get something out of the Lotteries. Since the 1st of January they have paid the Government 30,830 Nats. for Contribucion Directa.

Canon Balestra has taken a large house in Plaza Concepcion for the Deaf and Dumb Asylum. There are many deaf people in this country, but not so many dummies, most of our public men stone deaf to the will of public opinion.

There was a prodigious Calemanic demonstration in the Cañada Belgrano on Friday night. When it was over, the demonstrators marched through Calles Suipacha, Piedad, Florida, and Rivadavia into the Plaza, where Dr. Roberts dissolved them with a rattling speech. Torches were carried at the head of the procession, and the cheering was tremendous. Three policemen rode in front, and Colonel Bosch and a Commissary in the rear.
