RAILWAY REFLECTIONS.

Not even the President's Address...

not only reviewed the report of the Company, but reviewed the country itself; and we confess to a certain pleasure in reading this speech, since it breathes so much faith and confidence in our future. None of his remarks are tinged with that melancholy narrow-mindedness which we so often encounter in English views respecting this country.

The suspension of specie payments, which has caused such a very heavy loss to the shareholders, is not so much to hurt appropriators on the country, but is dealt with in a free and liberal manner; Mr. Parish very rightly remembering that every country, even including his own, at one period or other had had to resort to the measure; and we are entirely with Mr. John Fair when he says, that the present fractional returns of the line may be regarded as a minimum, and that the railway has very large resources of undeveloped traffic, in connection with sheepfarming to fall back upon.

The plain statement of fact is, that the camp of Buenos Ayres are only now beginning to produce, and we would call Messrs. Parish and Fair's attention to the very changing current in camp affairs. The rent of a 'puesto' in any part of the territory through which the Southern Railway runs has risen to a figure which precludes the possibility of a purchaser being solely dependent on the yield of a flock of sheep. Every piece of land in the camp has yet to be levelled up to its right and proper producing powers; and if in the days of General Mitre's goblet of gold a puesto gave a yield of 300 arrobes of maize, 300 arrobes of potatoes, 300 bales of hay, and 300 lbs. of butter. Mark it on your tablets, gentlemen in London, that there is no country in the world progressing faster in production than the River Plate, and that if in former years, when the bread was put into the months of the estancia, sheepfarmers, and mestizos, you earned 8 per cent dividend, you will, when the long current of sixteen years rises from the artificial position of a Government 7 per cent guaranteed road to the independence of a great self-supporting 8 per cent dividend paying company, must have grown with the country through which it runs and risen with the traffic which it itself has developed.

Whoever remembers the history of the Buenos Ayres Great Southern Railway, knows the history of the province itself. What on earth can Mr. Lumb mean by proposing to make a railway to such a place as Chacabuco? The debate in the Chambers on the concession was as animated as any of the Rosista or Tejedorista debates of the present day. Even the very Government paused at the enterprise. No wonder, therefore, that English capitalists required some better guarantee for the interest on their money than the possible earnings on such a South American venture; and even when all was arranged, and the great glorious and free 7 per cent guarantee of the Government was granted, the whole scheme would have fallen through, owing to the deficiency of the guarantee on a small balance, had not a few friends come forward and made up the amount, which even the Government of the country declined to do. To build this railway it was necessary to plant two men at the corner of Calle Buen Orden and Caseros to note the number of carts that entered and passed and people that came and went daily; and on the first meeting of the committee, there was much in the meeting we report suggestive of remarks for which we now have no space. The saloon was brilliantly lighted up: some of the richest and most representative men of our market were present. It was evident to even the most superficial observer that whilst politicians were doing their best to plunge the country into blazing civil war, the Bolsa and commerce of Buenos Ayres was indistigable for peace. The inevitable then was finally made apparent, the instincts of constitutionalism prevailed, and Mr. Gladstone was summoned.

The German Government sternly refuses to admit foreign vessels to the German coasting trade, thus following the example of the United States.

The Dublin Town Council met yesterday afternoon and conferred the freedom of the City on Captain Potter, of the U.S. relief ship Constellation, 'as a mark of gratitude for the noble and generous assistance extended by the people of America to the people of Ireland in their need.' The Lord Mayor presided, and shortly after he had taken his seat Captain Potter, in the uniform of the American Navy, entered with his brother officers, the entire company rising to receive them. His Lordship, in addressing the Captain observed that the Corporation had sparingly bestowed this honour, and there were but three names of its recipients preceding that of Captain Potter—those of Mr. Isaac Butt, Mr. Gladstone, and President Grant. The Lord Mayor took occasion to say that the statement that the distress in Ireland was almost over with the outbreak of the rebellion, and that the proceedings terminated. A large crowd outside heartily cheered the American visitors as they drove away in the Lord Mayor's carriage. A ball was given last night by the officers of his ship.
