LOSS OF THE LUSITANO.

FULL PARTICULARS.

Yesterday we received our Rosario exchanges and in the 'Cosmopolita' of the 20th find the following interest ing details respecting the shipwreck at the mouth of the Guazu.

The Commander of the Veloce re ports to his Consul as follows:--

"On the 14th May, in the Martin Garcia Canal, at 10½ p.m. I descried a vessel on the Playa Honda, she was the Oriental schooner Lusitano with her flag half mast. We cast enchor and I sent a boat off to offer aid; she was two days lying there and making water. The Captain of the schooner thought she might be got off, and sent in our boat the mate to the Island of Martin Garcia to look for a vessel to take away the cargo. Hardly had my boat got back when it came on to blow very hard, and the Veloce had to drop her second auchor, the wind being favorable very soon the Lusitano got afloat, but shortly afterwards she rolled over and went right down in 8 metres of water only, the tops of her masts being visible. The crew clang to so strong that they were in imminent the frightful plight of these poor fellows but could render no assistance, owing to the waves and wind.
