She left Buenos Ayres before the last mail packet, and reached England after its arrival. The previous steamer's advices noted the prevalence of unfavourable rumours respecting the Welsh colony.

The site of the Welsh colony is es pecially endowed by nature with great material and physical advantages, and so respectable an authority as the late Admiral Fitzroy describes it as being admirably suited for the establishmen of an English settlement. It is situate on the banks of the Chupat, a beautifu river near New Bay, a magnificent basin forming a capacious harbour for the use of the colonists. The coast is well adapted for the growing of wheat and other cereals, and the neighbouring camp furnishes abundant pasturage for sheep and cattle.

I have no doubt many of your readers could give valuable information respecting Patagonia, and the facts would just now be exceedingly useful.

THE NEW PERUVIAN IRONCLAD.

The Peruvian armour-clad steam ram Independencia left the Thames on Sunday, the 27th ult.
