THE RAN NICOLAS POST OFFICE.

San Nicolas, March 22, 1866. To the Editors of the 'Standard,' Gentlemen,

I beg that you will allow me a small place in your valued paper to ask the Post-master General at what house the post-office of San Nicolas-is supposed to be open?
