

March 18th. The beef continues good. To-day we shift quarters, and tents have been given round, one for 4 men: two inside and two outside, for, even packing them close, 4 men could not fit in one. The fleet has at last moved up towards Santana, and tomorrow or next day the vessels will reconnoitre and take possession of the river: on the 20th the small steamers are to take up their position at Paso la Patria. In the evening we moved our camp about a league, but these d-d flies accompanied us to our new quarters. The men carried boughs of trees to open a passage through the dense clouds of flies which enveloped us, but they stuck to us from head to foot.
