The lest bell for high mass was ringing as we were unsaddling our horses, and after ordering them some of the best fodder in the country, we were off in a crack to the church. Departing from my companion, with difficulty I procured an entrance at the door of one of the side aisles, for the church was uncomfortably crowded with numbers of both sexes and of various nationa. lities. The high alter with its gilded pillars was the first object to attract attention, and was shown off to advantage by the great number of wax candles; it was beautifully ornamented with vaces of garden flowers and exotics of an exquisite fragrance, and also with artificial flowers made by the industrious fingers of the town ladies, which were the best imitations of nature I have ever seen: in fact it was only from the large number on each stalk that I could tell at a distance of three or four yards that they were not the handiwork of Dame Nature. The choir was excellent on the occasion, and the mass well sung by the curs of Moron. The sermon was preached by the celebrated elecutionist Padre Mora, believed to be one of the mest popular pulpit orators of the day. He managed his subject with great






