PILIBUSTERING IN THE PROVINCES

The news from the Interior by the last mails is significant; whatever doubts we may have originally entertained as to the real object of the disturbers of the peace in Mendoza, they are now quite dispelled. The plain fact of the matter is, that there is a decided attempt to Walkerize the Interior, and the sooner we all open our eyes to this fact the better.

No man in the present century has done more to identify his name with disorder, invasion and rebellion than the redoubtable stock-broker Walker; and imbued with a due respect for his indisputable reputation, we think it is a misnomer to call the present row in the Interior, the "War in the Andes," or the revolution in Mendoza: the real title should be The Walkerizing of the Provinces.

Colonel Oloscagua, who has recently

arrived from Chile with 200 men to help the revolutionary cause, is the true South American Walker of the day; whether his efforts will meet with the same momentary success as his prototype, remains to be seen, but from what we can see and learn of the state of things up the country, we think Paunero will have no very easy easy job to subjugate this Chilian Walker. Tayaty, Dec. 8th 1866. But little has occurred since my last, to disturb the monotony of our

camp life. On the 2nd inst., birthday of the Emperor Don Pedro II. the Marques de Caxias reviewed two Brazilian divisions: in passing down the lines he called on the men to give a 'Viva' for Brazil, which elicited a loud and lengthened cheer. He then gave a 'Viva' to 'the Emperor, but it was

faintly replied to. Some days back we mounted on both lines several heavy howitzers, and the Brazilians have done some good firing. The Paraguayans also opened fire, but their shells burst half-way. Yesterday we lost the gallant Capt. Escobar, a Correntino, who was surprised by an ambuscade of the enemy: he fought singlehanded, but received 4 lance-wounds, and died in a few hours. Some men were quickly mounted, to avenge his death, and succeeded in driving back

the intruders. During the lull in operations out camp has been invaded by crowds of Correntina women, and every night the men get up dances by the light of Chinese lanterns and to the sound of the fife and drum, thus making the most of the few hours they may have to live. EDITOR'S TABLE.

We learn on good authority that a careful estimate of the war, made at

lowing returns:-Paraguayans killed 35,000 Brazilians do. 26,000 Argentines do. 5,000

As these figures are generally believed to be near the truth they are very significant, and show how the account of this war stands. There is one item, however, which has been omitted, namely, the influx of gold into the River Plate since the commencement of hostilities, and it is almost as important for us to know this as the foregoing figures. The closest calculation gives from 70 to 80 millions of patacons: at first we were inclined to regard these figures as exaggerated, but the amount has not been arrived at by a rough calculation, and we believe can be relied on. 


