Oct. 8th. The Italian gunboat Odono arrived, and the commander promised to protect us from Caceres and the assassins: on landing he was insulted by Caceres and 3 ruffians, but obliged them to retire: the foreigners again under arms.

Oct. 9th. Some Correntino cavalry arrived to restore order, and named Sangrá as Gefé.

AN ADVENTURE IN CORDOBA.

Estancia Angora—Cordoba Oct. 13th 1865. Gentlemen: I read the opinion of your Australian friend in reference to Cordoba, and although I do not agree with him in many respects, I cannot help confessing that there is great room for complaints, as I mean this short account of an adventure in the hills to show you.

THE BUCKLEY MURDER.

The heroic conduct of Sr. Perez in shooting down the murderer Lopez, is greatly talked of and praised by all estancieros and sheepfarmers. Had the fellow's life been spared, and had he been sent into the 'carcel' in irons, to stand his trial for the thirteen murders which he committed, the chances are ten to one he would have been sent to the army or laid in prison until people forgot all about him.

SCIENTIFIC RESEARCHES IN THE RIVER PLATE.

We are glad to welcome the distinguished Prussian 'savant,' Dr. Hensel, who has recently arrived; and of whose mission a Berlin journal speaks as follows: Seeing the great interest felt by all classes of society in the Humboldt Institute of National Science and Discovery since its foundation, we think the public will be glad to learn of its first scientific labors.

As soon as we receive further details concerning the aerolite catastrophe we will give them to the public, but our colleague ought better inquire into the truth of the matter than turn it to ridicule.

THE PUBLIC LAND QUESTION.
