MARCH OF THE VANGUARD.

(Army-correspondence of Col. Palleja.) October 11th .- The whole vanguard marched at 6 a. m., Paunero's division keeping in sight of ours. After 3 leagues we halted for the day on the Arroyo Ibicuy, on the edge of a wood: from here to Mercedes it is 9 leagues over level camp, without timber. The heat has been insupportable; our tents are pitched near a marsh, the exhalations from which make the atmosphere thick fires. We have news from Montevideo 26 25. In National Bonds there was great and heavy. For some days a storm has been threatening, and the epidemic among us increases: 2 Paraguayans and 2 Montevideans died to-day. Our German doctor, Arnold, is viewed with little favor by our men. The Brazilians are crossing the Mirinay and will follow Paunero's route. General Flores has sent a Correntino officer named Araujo to Curuzú-Cuatiá, to look for some money: we are all, officers and men, without a dollar and everything is very dear. The beef is now better, but Commissaries Rivas and Vidal intend to give up their contract at the end of the month. Julio Herrera, secretary to Flores, started to-day for B. Aires, to negotiate with the Brazilian Minister Octaviano for á loan wherewith to carry on the campaign, as our General is reduced to great extremities: everything has to be paid cash -oxen 148, mules 12 to 14, colts 4, horses 12 to 141 hard dollars, prices never before known in Corrientes.
