It is no longer the season of noisy bulletins, and the fever of war news has disappeared: the newspapers are flat and uninteresting, except in the item of wool-markets, for there is really little else to command attention, and even the Hispano-Chilian question only

provokes a yawn. But the campaign is not yet over, or perhaps hardly begun. The victories of Riachuelo, Yatay and Uruguayana have covered the allies with glory and resulted in freeing Rio Grande and Corrientes from the invaders. It is however, likely that Lopez will prove stronger in a defensive than an offensive war, and the hardships (many and dreadful as they have been) which the allies have already experienced fall so immeasureably short of those to be undergone in a summer campaign in the enemy's country, that Gen. Mitre and the other commanders have good reason to deliberate in a council of war whether it is advisable to push on active operations immediately.

It is all very well for after-dinner politicians in Buenos Ayres to insist on following up the successes already obtained, by a bold advance into Paragusy: little they think of the scorching heats, the pestilent swamps, the --- trackless woods and the thousand other new obstacles to the progress or maintenance of an invading army without a regular base of operations. Yet the opinion of all, citizens and foreigners, seems to be decidedly adverse to any hesitation or delay at present, as if they believed all the hard work accomplished and nothing remaining but to give Lopez the 'coup de grace.' Meantime Gen. Mitro neither under-rates the difficulties he has to grapple with, nor seems disposed to abandon those Fabian tactics which have heretofore stood him in such good part. Who could have supposed the recovery of Bio Grande and Corrientes would have been attended with so little bloodshed? We hear complaints of Corrientes having lost half-a-million head of catand that President Mitre was drawing on public credulity when he issued his famous draft for 90 days on Asuncion; but in reality no man could havedone more, nor could any campaign with such elements have proved more successful.

At present the allied army on the banks of the River Corrientes musters 30,000 strong, and by the end of the month we may expect to see the head quarters definitively settled at Goyn or the city of Corrientes. Lopez is at Humsytá with some 40,000 men around him, whom he will, doubtless, henceforward command in person, as all his licutenants have turned out such 'muffs': he has no fear of an attack by land, but is thought to be rather nervous about the River Paragnay, and bent on hazarding another naval battle be the formidable ironclads.
