Our guide, however, was right in saying that the hot sun of these few days would dry up all the bañados,' and we have happily crossed the swamps and arrived to-day at 6. 45 p. m. on the 'Arroyo Pay-Ubre' dry footed: these 'bañados' instead of 3 leagues hardly exceed one league in width, and 2 miles more will bring us to 'Paso Lucero' on the River Corrientes. To-morrow, at daybreak we con tinue our march, and by sunset will

have crossed the river, which is distant 180 leagues from our homes in Monte Video. And still the word is 'onward,' to give Liberty to Paraguay! From Villanneva our march hither has been through delightful woods and thickets, where the majestic Nandubay and Algarrobo held divided sovereignty among the leafy glades, and gave evidence of a vigorous and colossal vegetation. The scenery is wild in the extreme, and it was only by the aid of two companies

The only business in specie to-day was for cash stagnation in the specie market. The brokers have no orders, and have apparently lost the sold at cash prices. In National Bonds there heavy, and one or two well-known brokers are trying to 'bear' the market. The extreme heat, and the immediate leaving of the packet with the mails for Europe, caused a rather slim attendance on 'Change. The most important topic on 'Change to-day was the splendid grant of land made by Sr. Orožo, the Governor of Santa Fé, to Sr. Dn. Estevan Rams, as agent for a new American colony of southern planters. We could not obtain full details about this business as Sr. Rams and Rupert have already left for Rio; but, as far as we understand, the Government of Santa Fé has granted one thousand two hundred and fifty square leagues of land to Dn. Estoven Rams in trust and for the use and benefit of five thousand American families who propose to settle thereon. So liberal a concession untramelled with conditions has met with the greatest approbation from the whole commercial community of Buenos Ayres; and it is hoped that Dn. Esteven Rams will succeed in his negotiations with General Wood, who is at present in Rio Janeyro.

We heard of one sale to-day in saladero pro duce, 2,000 salt hides from Oliden's saladero, at 31 rls. per 60 libs., the tallow corresponding at Some shares of the Bien Hechera del Plata sold 15 rls. There have been some very important to-day at 65. They cost originally only \$5. Paper sales of novillos during the week at 160 to 165, and several large troops have arrived. The killing is about the usual average in Barracas. Salted Theatre Franco-Argentin hides look something firmer, but we could hear nothing about tallow.

Politics are again beginning to be discussed or 'Change, and speculators are busy with the most important state secrets, divulged by private letter it is even said that some half dozen of the princi pal brokers keep a special reporter at the allied camp, and that his letters are not of a favorable tenor. We attach, however, little importance to broker's news, nevertheless, it is right to observe that there is an uneasy feeling about the state of things; both here and up the river; parties who have borrowed specie on paper are beginning to pay off their obligations, and to-day's THREE SUBSCRIPTION news from Montevideo respecting the calling in all loans by the Maua Bank has tended greatly to augment the apprehensions of merchants. The Maua Bank, it is said, will be obliged to follow the same conrect here as in Montevideo-all outstandings will be called in-which will necessarily increase the growing stringency of the money market. Collections round town to-day were rather good, but the market shook under the heavy demand for paper money this afternoon for woo purchases; one of the leading brokers informed us that at least fifteen millions of paper money was sent up to the plazas to-day, and next week the demand will be still greater. As we before remarked, paper money is not coming back from the places this year so fast as last, and more than half the sheenfarmers take their surplus funds to the camp : the deposits in the branch banks outside are rapidly increasing, but in town they are diminishing. Almaceneros tell us that their customer outside are regular in their payments, and nearly all the pulperos have balanced their accounts the orders from the camp are greatly in excess o those during the same period last year. Business with the country dealers could not be much brisker, and millions of dollars worth of goods are at present waiting in town for bullock carts to take them out. The Provincial Bank, we heard today, still holds an immence specie reserve on hand, but paper money is fast going out and very little coming in; it is probable, therefore, that next week the Directors will raise the rate on naper. The two private banks, although doing an excellent city business, have as yet very little country connection. We advert to this in consequence of offering in the market, and invariably discounted by private parties. The banks, it seems, eschew country paper, no matter how unquestionable or first class, owing to the trouble in collecting, and refuse the best estancieros' names in the country, unless with a good city endorsement. The consequence is that the very safest and best paper offering in the market never finds its way to the private banks.
