From twenty-five years of age to the close of life the mean age unless relieved by the arrival of consul of married men was sixty and twoor of an agent appointed by him for tenths, while that of unmarried men was only forty-seven and seven-tenths. Very nearly one-half of all the bachelors who died had not attained thirty years of age. In the case of married men, by far the largest number died between 60 and 80 years of age. The results, Dr. Stark thouggt, clearly proved that the married state was the condition of life best fitted for mankind, and that the prolongation of life by that state was a special provision of nature. It was based on fixed laws of life. Married men were generaley more regular in their habits, better housed, better cared for, and more under the conditions of health and married as compared with the unmarried, though the difference was not so marked as in the case of the men. Married women died at a higher proposion during the three quinquennial neriods (from 15 to 20, from 20 to 25, and 25 to 30), but at a lower rate from 30 to 40. The death-rate in the case of married women was higher again between 40 and 45 years of age, but the rate was in their favour again from the latter period to old age.
