MR. WASHBURN'S INTERVIEW WITH CAXIAS.

It is much to be regretted that the army correspondence from Paraguay has fallen to the pens of pettyfoggers. The days are gone when the public of Buenos Ayres were treated to the truthful narratives of Sinbad and the classic epistles of Antar...

There is a whimsical disguise so obvious in the seedy letters which come to us from Tuyuti that army writers have ceased to command attention; we go through the correspondence pro forma, satisfied that we are reading a one-sided version.

The relations between the United States and Paraguay seem to be willfully misunderstood in the River Plate. Last September, when on high official authority we stated that come what might the Washington Government was determined to send its envoy to Paraguay...

We confess that we are unwilling to believe the assertion, although Caxias has taken so much care to frighten away independent army correspondents...

Distant though Paraguay be from the United States it is not too far from the American Government to maintain with dignity its flag, and humble though the representative his position admits of no such compromise as our colleague insinuates.

We take up the matter merely through a sense of right and justice, and to correct the impression which such nonsensical trash as the letter in question is calculated to impart. On the face of the globe there does not exist a nation more jealous of its dignity and its rights than the United States...

Mr. Washburn* acknowledges no power, no master, save his own Government, and it is preposterous to suppose that he would ask from Caxias what he more properly should apply for at Washington.

We therefore assume the responsibility of contradicting every line of this imaginary conversation, and feel quite certain that when the proper time arrives the Minister in question will bear us out. We must be permitted to complain of the utter want of courtesy in publishing such stuff, it can only be calculated to annoy American citizens in the River Plate...

Rosario, March 26th. Yesterday the Santa Fe Races came off, and with great eclat. Below you will find a technical account of them.

The English steamer Brazileira arrived from Rio on the 22nd, and has been put in quarantine for 12 days; she is quite a new vessel, built in 1865, and is sent out to be sold.

BATTLE OF TINOGASTA.

DEATH OF COLONEL CORDOVA.

At noon on the 4th inst. the town of Tinogasta, occupied by Colonel Cordova's division, was attacked by a body of the rebels 1,000 strong. So sudden was the onslaught that the garrison made no defence, an unparadonable lassitude appears to have reigned throughout the ranks...

Meantime Varela with 300 Chilean infantry had come up, and having effected a junction with the 1st corps, the united band poured down on the Plaza from all sides. The attack was irresistible, several of the palisades were forced and the defenders killed.

On our part we have to regret Lieutenant Lopez and Comandante Soria with forty file killed, and assistant Surgeon Sor. Langner Major Barea, and several others wounded.

The results of the day have unfortunately been very serious to the National cause, and nothing but the most wanton negligence could possibly have brought about such a result.

THE WAR IN PARAGUAY.

VISCONT F. DE BEAUMONT'S ACCOUNT OF THE BELLIGERENTS.

For the last two years the allies have been carrying on a war of extermination against Paraguay; although the theatre of events is so distant it may interest our readers in the old world to get a glance at some of the scenes of conflict.

The seat of war is a thousand miles from the sea. The River Plate at its mouth is 90 miles wide, and the Paraná in some places is 20 miles across; hot us follow up this immense water-course, in the rear of the Brazilian fleet.

Passing Corrientes, the city of pretty girls and white buildings, basking in the sunshine, and at present the seat of the military hospitals, we come to the Tres Bocas at the confluence of the Paraguay and Upper Paraná rivers.

Imperial fleet is at anchor, near Curru- day, is a far more serious business than we first supposed, and is calculated to have a very great moral effect, like the defeat of Campos some months ago; the whole misfortune is attributed to entrusting forces to men who are unfit to act as leaders.

On the opposite side of the river Paraguay is the Gran Chaco, a fine hunting territory inhabited only by Indians; these are mostly of the Guaycurú tribes, and singularly ferocious, being even accused of cannibalism.

Beyond this we meet only 'esteros' or lagoons, and heaps of dried up bodies here, there, and everywhere. This war is carried on without any quarter, without respite even to bury the dead or attend to the wounded.

The Paraguayan fight almost naked, sometimes wearing a shirt, a 'poncho,' and a hard leather helmet bearing the national tricolor. They are most indefatigable, industrious and expert, and can in a few hours construct very commodious ranchos.

From the camp they have a telegraph wire to Asuncion the capital (300 miles distant). The women, when not fighting beside the men in the trenches, or cooking the 'asado' and maize, make very beautiful embroidery and needle-work.

Men women and children, all the inhabitants of Paraguay are at Paso Pucu, or working for the army in the field.

The name of the coal vessel which the mutiny occurred is the Prince Albert; she is completely under water in front of Esquina. She was built in Windsor, Nova Scotia, and part owned by the Captain, whose share we understand is not insured.

EDITOR'S TABLE.

The rain which was so much wanted and prayed for has at last come. Yesterday we saw parties from various points of the camp compass; all state that it has rained outside; all fears for our camp friends are therefore dispelled.

The tone of our colleagues has suddenly assumed the most gloomy character. The Nacion in an article on the candidates for the Presidency openly states that Urquiza sighs for the post, and asserts that Dr. Diognes Urquiza has actually purchased in Montevideo half a million of gun caps; we suppose this is for the election.

To-night the benefit of Nicolao comes off at Colon. Briol's husband has great claims on the Buenos Ayres public. We have no doubt the house will be crowded.

We hear now that it is probable some more troops will be brought from Tuyuti to reinforce Gen. Paunero; as yet however there is nothing very certain known about this, but it is talked of in the Government-house.

The Proveedor arrived yesterday from Corrientes and the Guarani came in on Tuesday afternoon; there is nothing particularly fresh from there.

The troops sent up to Osorio have been taken from Curruza, and only 2,000 men are in that place, but as the fleet supports the column there, it is not probable that the Paraguayans will fall on this small body, besides they are defended by immense ditches and some forty pieces of brass cannon.

We received from Mr. Welshman the full particulars of the wholesale assassination at one of his puestos. We hope the Government will do something in the matter; such an awful cold blooded massacre should not be allowed to pass unpunished, and if the assassin be caught the hollow farce of sending him into town to remain in prison months and months awaiting his trial could well be dispensed with.

The auction of the Canadian barque Porto Rico has been postponed until to-morrow at 11 o'clock, in front of Llavallol's house.

The steamer Guarani was detained on her way down this time by some mud getting into her pumps. The Proveedor brings later dates.

The Chacabuco is coming down to Buenos Ayres, her spars lashed to her bows. She seems to be in rather an ugly plight.

Mr. Billinghurst has sold the wreck of the Amphitrite by auction in the sum of four thousand one hundred patacons. The purchaser Mr. Sebastian Chicero.

The Clene made a splendid trip down the other day from Corrientes to Rosario in 44 hours, and from thence to Buenos Ayres in 21 hours, in all 65 hours; the Captain keeping up all the time full speed, in order to oblige the Secretary of the British Legation, who was on board and anxious to arrive in time to write by the mail.

The arrival of horned cattle at the 'corrales' is as large as ever, and the people who live near the Barracas bridge can hardly go out of doors owing to the continued troops which pass by. A novillo escaped the other day and pursued a poor woman; the people who were in the street at the time rushed into a shoemaker's shop. It is high time that a stop should be put to this cattle driving in the streets.

Herman the wizard is still at headquarters, where he draws crowded quarters, as the soldiers have just got their pay. He must be doing a rather good business.

THE CHACABUCO MUTINY.

ANOTHER VERSION.

Full Particulars. Rosario, March 20, 1867. To the Editors of the Standard, Gentlemen, I drop you a few lines with respect to the mutiny of the Sala Contingent, which took place on board the steamer Chacabuco on the 7th of this month.

We arrived in Parana the 10th of March, at 7 o'clock p.m., got out on board, and started again on the 11th, about 6 a.m., up the river; did not call anywhere else for provisions, and we arrived at Esquina on the 14th inst., at seven o'clock p.m. Between Parana and Esquina the soldiers began to grumble; but the ship's company could render them little assistance, their rations were the same, with the exception that they got 8 biscuits a day, about 11 ounces weight per day, and little coffee in the morning, and some calia.

The following is an account of the mutiny.—About 12.15 p.m., on the 16th of March, a fight commenced on the quarter-deck of the Chacabuco. Plejfos began to be fired off, and I saw the soldiers armed with cut-throats, muskets, and all in motion. I made a jump and came against a man who fired a pistol at me, but missed; he fired again, and struck the steward of the barque in the left breast: I do not think he can live. The soldiers had all the arms in their possession, as they mounted guard all the way up at the fore-cabin door, where the arms were kept, so they had charge of all; not a sailor was harmed. Some were sleeping aft, others forward, and the remainder round the ship. Some took the boat, and others swam to an island; one man was drowned, and another either killed on deck or thrown overboard; no one knows. That is the entire that were lost.

The captain of the steamer got on board of the barque, but thought he was not safe there, so he jumped overboard and swam to an island that was near, where he remained until the ship came back after lauding the rebels on the shore on the side of the Grand Chaco, which was done about 7 o'clock, a.m.

They robbed the ship of all the money and valuable property they could find; also the arms and powder. The barque they served in the same way. As soon as they got possession of both vessels they searched them, and made all the men prisoners, with the exception of two, the second captain and the second engineer. They kept telling the men when they were prisoners they did not want to hurt them, as they were poor men like themselves, and that any one might go with them that liked, and they should have their liberty.

They still kept charge of the barque's deck until they had completed the search of the steamer, and were convinced that there were no more arms on board than what they had. They served out calia, water, and tobacco to the prisoners on the steamer's deck. They then consulted, and came to the conclusion of taking the barque's boats, and as they were on deck, they forced the sailors to hoist one out, but it leaked so much that it would not float; another difficulty then arose, there were no engineers to be found, so they could not work the vessel. The men in the barque defended themselves in the cabin, until they told them that they should not be hurt or robbed, and to come on deck; and they seeing no other remedy but to do as they were told, they were made prisoners, and a few were told the
