British Consulate, Rosario, January 20, 1868. To the Editors of the Standard, Gentlemen,-

There appears a paragraph in your issue of 17th inst., which I feel it incumbent on me to correct. It runs as

"It appears that the Municipality of Rosario, taking the advice of a medical consulta, including the British Consul, Mr. Hutchinson, prohibited an express train being sent to Villa Nueva to bring the troops, on the plea that under present circumstances their arrival would endanger the public health."

The truth of the matter in this case is, that I was invited, amongst other residents, there being only three municipales in Rosario, to consider the best means of applying hygiene to arresting cholera in this city, or, in the words of the letter from Mr. Paz, "varias medidas hijienicas á consecuencia del estado epidemico en que se halla esta ciudad."

In the jails a fumigation cell is kept, into which every prisoner is intro duced and stript; his clothes are left there while he is bathed, the prison dress is put on him, and he is placed in a separation cell for two days; if there is no appearance of cholera in that time he is forwarded to his regu-

In a room with choleratic patients chlorine should not only be kept in action in the ordinary vessel, but the utensils used by the patient should always have chloride of lime in them.




