

The hours for removal were from 4 a.m. to 7 a.m., and from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m., the waggons all covered; the cask contained about 18 gallons, something like a kilderken with a small loose head fitted in iron bands; when full you sent your ticket to the office, paid 1s., and had a clean tub left; the tubs are easily put in the waggon, with hooks, without any inconvenience to the house. When the waggon was full it would go to the Company's premises at "Papendrop," all the liquid strained off, and sent to the sea by pipes. At the time of my May last, the Company was selling a great deal of their manure.

Gentlemen, the above are facts. without colouring, the simple cheap way in which the sewage of 30,000 inhabitants is removed and turned to a profitable account. Now let me ask one question, could not that plan be carried out here in B. Ayres, where horses are so cheap. Your answer is, Yes, I hear it. Well if we laid down rails for a tramway from the end of the town to two or three miles lower down the river, the waggons fitted . with wheels for the line, the horses taken back, six horses could take 10 waggons along the line, come back with clean casks ready for the town waggons; the number of waggons would be about 100 casks, or iron boxes 14,000-in all I believe the town could be cleansed to a great extent with a capital of 2,000,000 dols. and a first-rate income divided by the company for the manure they could easily make.

Let a decree be passed, seal all the bestial cesspools up; but before doing this let them all be kept open with pipes leading over the housetops for some days, and filled up, and see in a few months if the health of the city does not improve. We must either do this or lay down brick barrel drains, and arrest the cholera if it again makes its appearance.

Ireland twenty years ago. The success of beet sugar-farming in the north of France and Belgium, in the same tempe us to try the experiment in England. Great improvement has been within the last ten years. Improved hydraulic presses have increased the yield of sugar from the roots, the introduction of carbonic acid greatly facilitates the clearing of the juice, and the use of steam, passed from one evaporating pan to another, has cheapened the cost of evaporation. The pulp, when squeezed dry in the state it leaves the hydraulic press, is said to most conveniently used for cattlefeeding, and its consumption on the farm secures for the land almost the

A sugar-refiner in the city, Mr. Jas. Duncan, of 9 Mineing-lane, who at present uses 300 tons of French beet sugar a week, is desirous of making a beginning, and is so well satisfied with the sugar-producing qualities of English-grown sugar beet, as tested by cost, to take the risk of erecting buildings and machinery for the extraction of the sugar. He proposes to place these near a railway station, in a good root-growing locality in one of the Eastern Counties, and is prepared to coming season at 18s a ton. He intends to carry the process of manufacture here no further than the extraction and thickening of the juice to such an extent as will enable it to bear carriage to his sugar refinery at the Victoria Docks, where it will be mixed with West India sugar, and the process of manufacture be completed. The dry squeezed pulp will be returned to the farmer at little more than the nominal price.

The kind of beet is the white Silesian, and the average weight of the roots must not exceed 31lb. The land, therefore, must not be over-manured, and the roots should be grown at closer intervals than where the object is to produce weightier roots. These are matters of detail which any LATEST FROM MONTEVIDEO. experienced root grower will be able to arrange without difficulty.

Here, then is one condition towards success which was wanting in the Irish experiment-a certain market for the roots when grown. The present price of corn is not likely to be maintained after the next crop is reaped. And the return from a crop of sugar beet, at 18s a ton will bear a favorable comparison with a crop of corn at the average price.

Should this experiment prove successful it may be the means of developing a new and important branch of agriculture in this country, and I therefore request insertion of this short statement in your calumns.

### MAXIMILIAN.

The costin of the late Emperor was again opened on its arrival in Europe, to determine the identity of the body. When the lid was raised there was a fine penetrating smell of the gums and other ingredients used in the embalming. The face is of a dark brown colour, and the skin shines as with a polish, caused, no doubt, by a varnishlike coating which has been applied to it to ensure preservation. The mouth is slightly open. The eyes have been replaced by others of glass, which, if I recollect rightly, are of a different colour to those of the Emperor. They were taken from a figure of the Virgin because probably there were no others at hand. The forehead has lost much of the hair that originally covered it, and at the sides of the head-at the temples-where the bullets entered, are small patches of velvet. The beard. which the Emperor wore long and full, is in perfect preservation. It has been combed downwards in a broad line, while the deceased, when living, always had it divided. so that it formed Ruivo, Lisbon, to Mary Waterson, daughter of a point on either side.


