Whether this is true or not, we cannot say; but we are not surprised that such stories should be industriously circulated to extenuate

the sanguinary vengeance wreaked by the Colorados. The Montevidean Revolution affords a great moral for South American politicians; for it has proved the impotence of crime to triumph even when supported by a powerful and active vided clique split into factions. The Colorados committed political errors, which, if unattended with retributive consequences, would make all history, against nine newpapers for publishing all political experience a falsity. The suspension of specie payments exasperated merchants; the impunity which camp assassins enjoyed enraged estancieros, whilst the scandalous revolution attempted, and even carried out, by

Fortunato Flores, caused a schism in the very party of which the unfortu nate Flores was the head. Thus it was that in a measure the Colorados are responsible themselves for the rebellion to which their grave political errors, we must, as impartial observers, say led; not that by this we mean to offer an excuse for the barbarous murder of General Flores; but to those who have carefully studied Oriental politics it must be matter of very little surprise that the Blancos rose in rebellion, when a clique of the very Colorados themselves set the example. Possibly, it is just as well that the present rulers in Montevideo should learn those bitter truths, in order that henceforward a higher tone of political morality may be made the standard of Government.

But the awful acerbity of party feeling between Blancos and Colorados is now painfully apparent, and we are happy to say that such dire animosity is unknown here, Unitarios, Federals, Crudos, Cocidos, all are on speaking terms, shake hands, and abuse each other, nothing more; but that party feeling could rise to such a pitch as to lead to open assassination in our streets, we confess we do not believe; the politicians of Buenos Ayres are not of that "sansculottes" stamp, and we grieve to see the Colorado party erecting a guillotine behind the Matriz and sending Blancos to kingdom come by the score. 
