The immense importance of the questions at issue, between the Government and the saladeristas, and the general anxiety felt in commercial circles lent increased

interest to the meeting. The Provincial Government, with the sole view of meeting the public wishes during the prevalence of cholera, published an edict suspending the working of the saladeros. 
