The obstructives have still too much ascendancy for mediocre men to face resolutely, so that, until a man of equal nerve, ability and comprehensive social economic views arises, our period of emerging from and social condition is not calculable. Possibly, however, it may be nearer than we think for. Let us hope and strive to conjure the spirit.


