the relations which exist between brokers and their principals, is now attracting public attention. An exporting house gave an order to a broker to purchase sheepskins, and to a large extent, representing the amount of \$200,000. The produce was purchased, as sometimes is the custom, in the name of the broker and duly delivered at the barraca. When the sellers sent to recover from the broker. he naturally fell back on his principals, but these refused to pay, as they alleged that the broker owed a large amount to them, arising from previous transactions. The question was referred to a judge of 1a. instancia, but he refused to give any decision until he had consulted his judicial brethren. The case is now carried to the 'Tribunal de Commercio.' It is one of many arising from the injudicious habit of bro: kers purchasing either produce or public funds in their own name. The law, we believe, is terminant on the point in regard to fixing the responsibility in such transactions; but morally, or conventionally, the broker is exonerated from blame. This is all right in equity, but if such transactions are to be discontinued, they should be made penal. That the foolish broker should himself, be the sufferer, is the least evil attending a custom which demoralizes the commercial community; and is tantamount to putting forward the name of a straw on a bill. The honest sellers of the product are the victims of an irregularity, the material responsibility of which is divided between a broker and his principal. The difficulty is not to fix the responsibility, but to make it available. The new Steamer "El Capitan" built


