LOSS OF THE YACHT CHALLENGE. At a late hour last evening we received intelligence of the total loss of the yacht Challenge, belonging to Mr Jacob Lorrellard, of this city, while bound out from the port of Para in Brazil to New York City. The Challenge was modelled and built by Captain Fish, a well-known yacht builder, and was regarded as a first-class yacht in yachting circles. The Challenge was 310 tons burthen, and was originally built in May 1867, for pleasure sailing. She was very heavily sparred; in fact she had as large spars as any merchant vessel, and in a fresh breeze could only be compared to the Dauntless for her breadth of canvas and manner of The Challenge sailed from Para for this port with a cargo of bluing and India rubber, the estimated value of which was about \$300; partially insured. The vessel herself was valued at about \$50,000 by her owners, but would probably bring for yachting purposes abut \$10,000, as she has been used ever since she was built for the purpose of carriving merchandise. The Challenge has carried cargoes of fruit between Havana and New York City. The Challenge was the largest yacht ever built in America, with the exception of Mr. Kingsland's Alarm. The loss of the Challenge was owing to her having run on a reef about fourteen miles from Para outward bound. The crew, of a dozen men, became frightened and desmora lized at the danger, and although Captain Fish and his officers attempted by main force, with loaded pistols, to prevent them from deserting, yet they utterly refused to obey their officers' orders, and, taking to the boats, deserted the vessel. When they left the vessel was fast going to pieces on the reef. The officers and crew were picked up by the steamship Mississippi, and then reached New York late last evening. The Challenge was a swift boat, having at one time made passage to and from Para and New York in about fifty-seven days, which is considered very quick time. The owner also at one time offered to match the Challenge against the yatch Sappho for a large sum of money, but the stakes were never put down to run the race. 




