THE VERMEJO NAVIGATION.

A humble notice from the office of the Minister of the Interior, calling for proposals to navigate the Vermejo river, has attracted our attention. We trust this will lead to something, as up to the present time there is little known respecting this majestic river we are aware that it rises in Bolivia and for 1.200 miles irrigates the fertile vallies of the Chaco; it falls into the river Paraguay a little above Humaitá. The first expedition to explore these unknown waters was in 1826, when a heroic band of Englishmen accompanied by a few Argentines, successfully descended the river; th inexorable Francia, the tyrant of them in prison for a lengthened pe

For thirty years the peaceful waters of the Vermejo were undisturbed, save by the wandering 'Guicuru,' who in his rude 'piragua' paddled up and down the stream. In 1856 an enterprising Bolivian, Señor Arse, accompanied by a Dublin sailor, named William Martin, navigated the Vermejo from Oran to the Paraguay river: subsequently Señor Arse made four voyages, the last in November, 1863, on which occasion he had cedar, the lapacha, the algaroba, the two men killed by the Indians; he, however, succeeded in bringing down other hard woods of the Chaco and 150 tons of cargo and ten first class passengers. A patent has been lately granted for this Republic to the introducer of a very new invention which is destined to effect a complete revolution in masonry and house building. The inventor is an Englishman, and in Paris alone has constructed two hundred houses on this new system, which consists in raising walls without employing bricks or stone. A cement is used, something like water which is poured into moulds, and it hardens very rapidly enabling houses to be run up in a marvellous short time. once hardened the cement acquires a firmness like stone and the walls may be said to be made of one piece, making them better adapted for painting, or railing &c., than those of brick and less liable to dampness. A patent has been also taken for the same invention in Montevideo and we understand a practical experiment of it will shortly be made first in Buschantal's Quinta, and afterwards in this city.






