> That the object of the Constitution is to promote the general welfare and to guarantee the blessings of liberty to Argentines and to all who choose to dwell in Argentine territory.

> That Articles 14 and 20 of the Constitution secure to all the inhabitants of this Republic the right to follow any trade or profession, but that the order of the Board infringes on that right.

> That every order or decree that infringes on the Constitution is null, inasmuch as the Constitution is above everything.


