

With the design of shortening the voyage to Punta Arenas, Captain Maine proposes to explore some channel, that may be easy of navigation and may lead to the end desired. The survey will be limited to examining the route beginning in Sarmiento Channel as far as Newton Island, and continuing by Collingwood Strait and Union Gulf to Cape Earnest: thence passing to Cape Grey by Ancon sin Salida, continuing by Kirk or White's Narrows, as may seem best, to the end of Obstruction Sound. Crossing then Fitzroy Channel, the nearest point to Punta Arenas can be reached-Otway Water—and at last to Punta Barley Arenas, avoiding the intermediate isthmus.

At the isthmuses above mentioned, it would be necessary to travel over eighteen or twenty miles of land, thus saving more than a hundred and fifty of navigation; and if we were to pass Obstruction Sound—a journey of eighteen miles-seventy more of navigation would be saved.
