REVIEW FOR EUROPE.

Since the sailing of the French packet on the 12th inst., no event of any decisive importance has occurred at the seat of war. Sr. Paranhos, the Brazilian Special Envoy, is still at Assuncion...

Captain Parsons, of H.M.S. Beacon, has not yet obtained the escort necessary to enable him to deliver a letter from Mr. Stuart, the British Minister at Buenos Ayres, to Lopez.

On the 9th, Lopez, taking advantage of the supineness of the Allied armies, mounted two 40-pounders on a railway wagon, and attaching a locomotive, proceeded to the bridge of Yagueti...

The State of Assuncion has improved, many families are daily returning, but there are still a vast number of people wandering through the mountains, afraid to return to Assuncion, dreading the vengeance of Lopez on their friends and relatives in his power.

Throughout the states of the Argentine Confederation complete tranquillity prevails, the gradually increasing influence of the National Executive, under Mr. Sarmiento's guidance, making itself felt in the most distant provinces.

In Buenos Ayres during the last fortnight business has been generally improving. The markets for produce have been firm, and some special lots of fine wool fetched high prices.

In Montevideo, things, though still extremely unsatisfactory and unsettled, are looking better. The committee of merchants and others appointed to examine into the state of the banks have submitted a report, together with voluminous statistics, to the English and American banks.

The general impression is favourable. The news from the sister city is in other respects unimportant. There have been some sales of wool at average prices, but trade in general is dull.

Business in Rosario is represented by residents as extremely dull, though there can be no doubt that the town still continues to improve, as within a short period no less than 87 hogs and business houses are said to have been opened.

In the province and city of Cordoba attention is principally directed to the Exhibition of next year. All Provincial Committees have now been appointed and have settled down to their work, the fruits of which we will see next year.

The up river trade continues of a limited description—there is no change of notice, with the exception of the increased demand for artle for the army in Paraguay.

The Government of Mr. Sarmiento daily continues to gain ground in the estimation of the public. The news received from England per last mail has inspired hopes that this country is at last being better understood in Europe.

The liberators of the nation. The decrees issued by the National Government within the fortnight chiefly relate to the subsidising and creating of new Colleges and schools in some of the provinces.

The approaching election of Representatives and Senators for the Provincial Chambers, fixed for Sunday next, 28th inst., absorbs the attention of everybody to the almost total exclusion of any other subject.

The magnificent collection of household furniture destined for the palace of the President of Paraguay Don Francisco S. Lopez, has after duly forming the subject of a lengthy official correspondence been declared lawful prize of war, and confiscated as national property.

The amount of capital necessary for the construction of the port of Buenos Ayres, proposals for the construction of which have been accepted by the Government, is put down at the enormous amount of 15,000,000 of hard dollars.

Friday last—St. Joseph's Day—the great day at San Jose. The festivities were on the usual princely style. Padre Jasota celebrated High Mass at the private chapel of San Jose.
