LATEST FROM PARAGUAY.

(STANDARD Telegram from Rosario.)

The Provocateur has brought the following news from Asuncion. Lopez has again fled further inland, and the allies have rescued 4,000 poor families in the mountains.

Head-quarters, Capibary, November, 30th. 5 p.m. Col. Fidelis, with the Brazilian vanguard, crossed the Jeju-Guazu last night and surrounded the enemy's position, which was soon abandoned, the Paraguayans escaping to the bridge of Jeju-Mini, pursued by the 11th battalion and some cavalry forces.

The cause of the present unprecedented low state of the rivers Parana and Paraguay, is, that the snow on the Cordillera has not as yet melted this year. Generally, the effect of the thaw is felt about this period of the year, but this season the waters are not expected to come down before next month, meanwhile the oldest river pilot has never seen the rivers Parana and Paraguay so low.

Madame Gasc appeared on Wednesday at the Opera House as Lenora in Trovatore. His Grace the Archbishop of Buenos Ayres, and the Rev. Canon Dillon arrived in England in excellent health, and after a few days stay, proceeded en route for the Eternal City.

On Wednesday the new station at the Western Railway was opened to the public. The station at night time, when well lighted up with gas looks really very splendid; the waiting rooms are lofty and spacious, but we call Sr. Madero's attention to the want of a waiting room for gentlemen, where tables with pen, ink, and paper can be had.

This is a great necessity, as, at present, if one wants to write a letter at the station, it is necessary to apply to the French lady who keeps the café. This new station is an ornament to the city, and improves greatly the appearance of the town in that neighborhood.

The briskest business at present going on in Buenos Ayres is brick-making; such is the demand for bricks that, although new kilns are started almost weekly, the price continues rising. All the proprietors of brick-kilns are making rapid fortunes; time was when this branch was completely monopolized by the Basques, but now the Italians have entered the business, still prices are really unreasonably high.

The rush for Lujan this year was greater than usual; over two hundred people were left behind at the Parque Station on Wednesday morning, owing to the impossibility of the manager to put any more into the carriages. The fetes commenced on Wednesday, but Mr. Estrada and others left town for Lujan in the last train on Tuesday.

All the law courts of this city are now closed; two judges, however, sit in chambers. The lawyers and escribanos are all making for the suburbs. Mr. Burton's office is at No. 32 Calle Belgrano. This is the chief office of the National Telegraph Department, and where young men will be instructed in the science.
