BRITISH DIPLOMACY IN BRAZIL AND THE PLATE.

flowever much the appointment of Mr. Layard to the English Legation at Madrid may disappoint the expectations of British diplomacy and interfere with the hopes of promotion of gentlemen already in the diplomatic service, it will assist in retaining at Rio de Janeyro and at Buenos Ayres the force of the objections to the introduction of Mr. Layard to the Spanish mission in disregard of the claims of "the Service," it saves Brazil and the Argentine Confederation from changes that have been too frequent. For what the English Government wants at Rio and Buenos Ayres are resident Ministers, who have time to make themselves acquainted with the true situation of the empire and the republic, good sense and good feeling. in their intercourse with those Governments and the society in those capiwell as personal ability, to send home correct representations of countries in which our commerce is far more deep. ly concerned than it is in all the smaller States of Europe. In Mr. Mathew. and Mr. Stuart we seem to have represcutatives of the right sort in Brazil and the Plate, and a few more years residence there will enable them to vernments to which they are accredited. From an artistic point of view it is impossible to speak too highly of these gates, and a contemporary, to whom the criticism of such works is a speciality, describes them as "an extraordinary product of the united efforts of art and industry.' The Art Journal, which presents its readers with an illustration, has the following remarks, which we cannot do better than quote :-

"The gates for the principal entrance to the station are the subject of about 14 feet wide by 11 in height; the lower panels are filled with a design suggested by the hawthorn, which with the rose and oak, are the types of the whole ornamentation. The plan of the piers is oblong, the sides and backs being filled with the same ornamental designs as the front: wings to match complete the set, which occupies ont any attempts at overmuch elaboration, the richness of the design is most striking, and at the same time is characterised by good taste: the merit must be given to Mr. Altred Barnard, one of the younger members of the firm, who originated and superintends ed the execution of the whole work this is entirely of wrought iron."

The engraving here referred to is circulated with our present number, and our readers will be able to judge for themselves of the merits of this really admirable piece of British workmanship. These gates form but a small portion of the whole work, as there were several pairs of a similar but slightly less ornamental character ranging in widths from 20 to 30 feet, being supported by cast iron fluted iron foliated capitals, vases, and lamps, the peculiarity of which columns being that each will sustain the leaf of a gate weighing a ton and a half, and supply their own foundation as well. This remarkable result is effeeted by a very ingenious contrivance which may be explained in a few words.
