THE CODE OF CIVIL LAW.

Deeds or other documents drawn up without the interference of a notary public or without being registered are as valid as registered deeds; the latter are styled public and the former private deeds. Both classes may be drawn up on any day of the week, including Sundays and holidays; public deeds must be drawn up in the national language, but private deeds may be drawn up between the interested parties in any language and without regard to any special form; whereas public deeds require to be drawn up on a nuiform system. Let it be clearly understood that by private deeds I mean documents of any kind drawn up by the interested parties, with or withont witnesses, and not those drawn up at an Escribano's office. Private deeds must be signed with the name in full, initials or marks are invalid; a person cannot be obliged to acknowledge as his a signature having only his initials or mark, but if he voluntarily admits the initials or mark to be his they are valid.

A person called on by the Courts to recognise a signature purporting to be his, is obliged to declare tacitly and without any equivocation whether the vows the signature the Court may order the writing to be compared, and also admit other proofs. When the important item respecting the returns of the signature to a deed is admitted to be Western Railway. The cost of the road, int. bona fide or declared bona fide by the Courts, the stipulations embodied in the deed are binding on the party and his anccessors.

Signatures given on blank paper and legally recognised are also binding, although the person who signed the blank sheet may object to the stipulations drawn up in it; this clause is, however, subject to certain restrictions.


