THE APPALLING DISASTER ON THE MISSISSIPPI.

The Philadelphia correspondent of the Times gives the following account Special Telegram

Another appalling steamboat disaster has happened on the Mississippi

The Stonewall steamed down the Cairo, at the confluence of the Ohio and Mississippi rivers, and just after dark on the evening of October 27 had reached a point about 25 miles below alarmingly ill, and his recovery Cairo, when an alarm of fire was doubtful.

Some deck passengers were playing with five reapers and one of Ransome hay, when the hay caught fire. One smother it by blankets, but did not land for investment succeed.

> The night was cold, the wind high, the current strong, and the fire spread, a panic seizing upon the deck passengers, who, in their flight, trampled guish the fire. Fanned by the wind. the blaze spread rapidly.

The pilot determined to run the steamer ashore, and she struck a gravel bar and grounded in about five feet of water.
