THE TRIPLE ALLIANCE WAR.

There are few of our readers, we imagine, who have had either time or inclination to wade through the letters now daily appearing in the native papers respecting the Triple Alliance. This correspondence is, without exception, the longest and most tiresome we have seen published for many years.

As regards the origin of the war, there certainly can be little doubt that the invasion of the Banda Oriental was the remote cause of all, and the writers seem to be getting beyond their depth when they meddle much with this side of the question; but the impartial observer cannot fail to remark that Flores only hurried an event which we all now can see was in every sense inevitable.

The Government of Paraguay, the fortifications on the Paraguayan river, the iron rules laid down for navigating the river, were all hostile to the spirit of the age, and sooner or later the struggle should come. We want an Edmund Burke to cast the horoscope of these countries at the moment; all that has been written in the papers is perille staff which reveals nothing.

Subsequently the savages made another incursion on the East frontier of Cordoba and Santiago del Estero, but incurred condign chastisement, without succeeding in carrying off any booty. Col. Orquera is now occupied in advancing the Cordoba frontier, by order of the National Government, and as soon as this is accomplished there will be entire protection for that part of the frontier line of Sta. Fe and Cordoba which lies outside Sunchales and the other colonies.
