

#### EDITOR'S TABLE.

We publish in another column a let ter from Mr Porter C. Bliss, of Paraguayan celebrity, which has appeared, in the New York papers, prefaced by the remarks of the Herald on the subject. Although it throws but little light on the intricate tale of the bloody war now drawing to a close, it contains revelations which must greatly interest those of our readers who have fol lowed from the beginning each phase of this unfortunate struggle.

We perceive that our excellent and highly esteemed friend and country. man, Don Ricardo O'Shee, who intends returning to Europe in a short time, has been appointed Consul-General in Spain for this Republic. The high position Mr O'Shee has for so many years held in this city, his vast and exceptional knowledge of mercantile affairs, and the personal popularity which he has always enjoyed in a pre-eminent degree, render this appointment a most acceptable one to al classes in this country.

News from the Rio Cuarto frontier is eminently satisfactory. The last Indian deputation which came to propose terms of definite submission and peace were entertained by Colonel Mansilla at a grand 'dejeuner' in the open air, after which the Indians favoured the company with their national dance, which bears, we are told, a striking resemblance to the 'can can.' The 'palaver' commenced immediately after, and resulted in a treaty which gives to the Republic an extent of three thousand square leagues of land south of the Rio Quinto frontier, and binds the Indians to live henceforth in peaceful amity with the settlers. Col. Mansilla is about to pay the head cacique a visit in order to ratify the treaty and judge for himself the value of this new territorial acquisition.

The prodigious rate at which new buildings are running up in this city may be estimated from the fact that, since the 1st November last, no fewer than one hundred houses bare been erected; but even this rate of production is unequal to the demand, for house rent continues to rise in all quarters of the metropolis.


