PRESERVATION OF BEEF.

REPORT OF THE NAT. COMMITTEE.

Our readers will remember that the prize of £1600 offered by Government for the best system of curing beef attracted numerous competitors, chiefly from Europe, but that none was deemed worthy of the prize. We translate the report of the Committee in a condensed form, as follows .-

B. Ayres, Nov. 1th 1869. The Argentine Government by de-

cree of Sept. 3 1868 offered a prize of \$8,000 for the best system of export- pickle. ing fresh meat, and proposals were invited from all parts of the world up to sion. Aug. 31 1869. A jury was appointed to examine the samples on Oct. 1st, which we accordingly did with the utmost study and attention. We regret to say that none of the systems proved entirely satisfactory or deserving the prize offered. Nevertheless some of the competitors displayed considerable skill.

Experience shows that putrefaction is due to air, water and a temperature over 010. It is clear that cold is the best antidote to putrefaction, for we have the case of Prince Ments chikoff's body, found in Siberia 92 years after his death, perfectly preserved. The difficulty is that ice is very dear and difficult to keep from melting, besides that meat once packed grease. in ice has a strong tendency to putrefaction on being exposed to ordinary temperature.

Without moisture or water- it is equally clear there can be no putrefac ion; hence the efficacy of completely drying meat by using Calsi or substances that absorbmoisture, in the same manner that we dry fruits or botanical drugs. 




