THE YEAR 1869.

The year that terminates to-day has hieady left its mark on the page of history by two splendid achievements per cent. National Bonds 54 to 57. that had long been deemed impracticable, namely the Pacide Railroad acress the continent of North America, and the Isthmus of Sucz Canal which has just been opened to traffic. The other most important events of the year have been, the inauguration of Pres. Brant's government in the United States, the formation of a Regency in Spain under Marshal Serrano, the abolition of the Irish Church, the summoning a General Council at Rome, and the death of Peabody the

To South America the past year has brought many changes, and as far as the River Plate is concerned we must regard it rather favourably. We have at last got out of the Paraguayan war, and on every side there are manifold proofs of the advance of industry and population. At the same time the Government shews itself animated by good intentions, and if we had a little more security for life and property the prospects of the River Plate territories could not be equalled by those of any other country except the United States or Australia.

The year 1869 may compare favorably with any of those of the past des cade; numerous valuable enterprises have been taken in hand, some of which are near completion; the prospects of the sheep-farmers are improving; agriculture makes unprecedented strides among the people, and the authority of the National Government is making itself felt in the interior provinces, where turbulent adventurers and the ruthless Indians of the lesert were hitherto unchecked and uncontrolled.

Meantime we have also gained ground abroad, the name of the Argentine Republic being now associated with Industrial Exhibitions and the progressive arts of peace, instead of sanguinary revolutions and interminable disorders which seemed the inheritance of all Spanish Republics-Let us be thereful to Divine Providence for the benefits of the past year and hope that no obstacle may arise in the path of progress on which the country has so happily entered.
