Montevideo, Dec. 30, 1869, 6 50 P.M. Business very dull.

Paper closed at 5 1/2 dis. Exchange done for large amounts at 5 1/2.

The year that terminates to-day has already left its mark on the page of history by two splendid achievements that had long been deemed impracticable.

To South America the past year has brought many changes, and as far as the River Plate is concerned we must regard it rather favourably.

The year 1869 may compare favourably with any of those of the past decade; numerous valuable enterprises have been taken in hand.

Pursuant to our custom we give a summary of the events of the past year in the order of the various months, as follows:—

JANUARY. News received of the fall of Agostura and flight of Lopez: 100 cannons and 1500 prisoners taken by the Allies.

CONCESSION TO ROLDAN AND MATTEI for navigation of the Vermejo. Grants for schools in the Provinces, amounting to £100,000.

FEBRUARY. National census ordered throughout the Republic. Loss of the steamer Santiago, from Chile.

MARCH. Lopez fortifying in the mountains of Azucra. Capt. Parsons with letter from British Minister to Lopez.
