Buenos Ayres, 10th October 1867. The following is a copy of Mr. Day' statement to the British Minister when despoiled of his property by the Gova ernor of San Juan :-

To His Excellency George Buckley Mathew Esq. U. B. H. B. Minister Plenipotentiary.

Sir,

I have the honor to lay before Y.E. the following facts:-I am a British subject and have been for some years past established in business in the town of San Juan, province of the same name. In the month of September 1866, I made a contract ble precedent to the justice of my for the purchase of 1,200 fat oxen and claim.. In the year 1859 a revolution 200 mules from a Sr. Germandia, and broke out in a province of Chile, Copion the 1st October of the same year I received said animals, and signed promissory notes in favor of Sr. Germandia for their value amounting to sixty thousand patacons. It was my intention to have sent these animals to Chile as soon as the passage of the cattle monthly.

As Y.E. is no doubt aware a revolution broke out in Mendoza in Nov 1866 which shortly afterwards spread to San Jaun. The governor of this place, Don Camilo Rojo, having deserted his post in the hour of danger, a new governor was appointed in the person of Don José Ignacio Flores, in accordance with the forms prescribed by the contitution, and the latter using a perfectly constitutional right, voluntarily delegated after a short time the Government to Colonel Don Juan de Dios Videla.

Foreseeing that I might be exposed to losses and trouble on account of the above-mentioned revolution, I hurried forward the arrangements for the removal of my animals, and repeatedly endeavored to send them out of the province even before the change of go. vernment.
