No one can for a moment doubt the great utility of Railways in this country: the results already given by the lines in actual traffic have been on the invested and the development of our industrial resources. We must not, however, fall into the error of riding a good horse to death, for an indiscriminate and hasty extension of our railway system would be productive of more evil than good. Suppose the Government, as soon as Congress assembles, should propose to devote one million sterling towards immigration this would suffice to pay the passage of 100,000 industrions English settlers: the occasion could not be more opportune, for the distress now prevalent among the workingclasses in England is so great that Her Majesty's Government are about to employ the ships of war as trausports to convey the people to Canada and Australia. When we consider what large sums are expended annually by the Governments of New Zealand, Queensland, New South Wales &c. in giving free and assisted passages, with land-grants, to able-bodied immigrants, and the success of such efforts in rapidly fostering the growth of those colonies, we certainly think the Argentine Government should imitate the example:

Almost immediately to the north of the Count's colony begins that of Helvelia, which has been founded in in the year 1855 by Dr. Romany from Berne. The land granted to him by Government extends over four leagues along the river, and two leagues inward from east to west, a part of the latter being unfit for cultivation on account of the floods. This is in general the great defect of all the lands lying between the San Xavier and the Saladillo Dulce only an average width of about one league can be considered as really good and available, all the rest, namely :- the lands adjoining the Saladillo being liable to inundation.

THE BRITISH HOSPITAL, MONTEVIDEO.

In the year 1857 it was found to be necessary to provide special Hospital accommodation in this city for our fellow-countrymen. A Building, affording a sufficient number of Wards to need our wants it that time was accordingly rented, and furnished with all the usual appliances. But in the year 1866, from the vast increase which had taken place in the number of vessels frequenting the Port, this Building became so overcrowded, that, on the appearance of an Infectious disease, it was felt that the lives of the patients were seriously endangered, while many applications for admission could not be entertained by the Committee. It was then resolved to put forth a special effort to procure larger and more suitable premises, and for this purpose an Appeal for Funds was made to the British residents, and was by them most liberally met.

A site was then purchased and a Building erected on it, furnishing Beds for Fifty Patients, besides Rooms for a Superint indent and Matron, a Surgery, and all the usual Offices; while it was so constructed that, should a necessity arise at a future day, additional wards can be added at a trifling expense. We have thus an Hospital, in all respects, admirably adapted to meet our necessities, and incurring expenses for general management hever exceeding our annual income.


