Weather unsettled.

THE NEW CUSTOMS DEPOSITS.

We took occasion yesterday to make

a personal inspection of the new ware-

houses built by Messrs. Lanuz and

Co., in Calle Balcarce, between Calles

Garay and Brazil, which have been

recently concluded and are now in use

as Custom-house deposits. The

flooding of the Aduana Chica these

new stores have been much spoken of,

and to our idea they are admirably

suited for the storing of merchandise.

It is objected that they are too far

from the centre of the town, but this

might easily be remedied by making a

tramway to connect them with the new

Custom-house, the distance being

only 1 1/2 squares or an English mile.

Some parties have suggested that the

proximity of the new stores to the

river-side exposes them to inundation;

but a view of the premises is quite

enough to dispel any fears on this

head.

It is now nearly three years since

Messrs. Lezica and Lanuz commenced

the edifice, which resembles in the

exterior an English factory without the

chimneys; the site was formerly a part

of Fair's quinta, on that part of the

barranca adjoining Lezama's quinta.

The view of the port and the Boca is

very pretty, and below the barranca

runs the Boca railway, close to a line

of white cottages near the Yellow

House. The site whereon the ware-

houses are built is fully 30 ft. higher

than the roofs of the cottages in ques-

tion.

The grand entrance is in Calle Bal-

carce, by a gateway 40 feet high, in

which is a ponderous iron gate of 20

feet in width. The edifice covers a

parallelogram of two English acres

being 400 feet from north to south,

and 200 feet from Calle Balcarce to-

wards the river, and comprising two

large blocks, separated by a passage

30 feet wide. Each block is subdivid-

ed into four warehouses, and each

warehouse has three floors; thus the

total area of flooring is equivalent to

six English acres. The north side in

Calle Garay has 14 windows, or rat-

her doors, and 3 large oriels; the

doors have gratings for ventilation in

dry weather, and also iron plated

shutters: on the south side, in Calle

Brazil, there is the same number of

doors or windows. The west side, in

Calle Balcarce, has 8 windows and 20

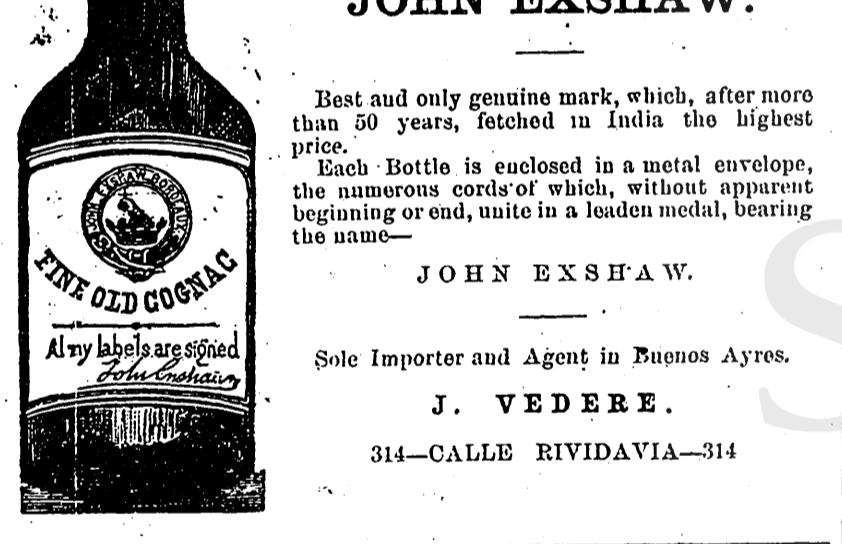
