REVOLUTION IN ENTRE RIOS. Proclamation of Lopez Jordan.

General Lopez Jordan has assumed the responsibility of the murder of General Urquiza and claims the merit of having liberated Entre Rios from a tyranny which he says had become intolerable.

Lopez Jordan has named Doctors Pedro Nunes and Juan Montero as his Ministers and sent Dr Reyua to confer with General Caceres, which is supposed at Concepcion to presage an invasion of Corrientes.

The first manifesto of Lopez Jordan was that addressed to the various Chiefs of Departments, dated the night of Urquiza's death (April 11th) to the following effect: 'The people of Entre Rios, weary of oppression and of seeing its degrading liberties weighed down by tyranny, has to-day unfurled the banner of freedom and revolt, and shaken off the degrading yoke of despotism.'

The details of the murder of Urquiza's sons, Justo, Carmelo, and Waldino, are said to be as follows:—Justo, who was Gefé Politico at Concordia, was sitting in a coffee-house on the evening of the 11th, when a messenger came to say that important despatches had arrived for him from Paysandú; while crossing the Plaza, close to the pyramid, the conspirators fell on him and inflicted twenty-nine stabs, which of course caused instant death.

Basques armed with rifles, whilst the gentlemen within were prepared to give a hot reception to any marauders bold enough to attempt to penetrate within. This morning at sunrise the flag at the British Vice-Consulate hung out at half-mast and the same tribute of respect to the memory of one who (whatever may be the faults of his life) was at one time acknowledged as the saviour of his country, and who for many years had proved himself a father to the people of the province, was paid by other flags of the town.

As Englishmen claiming the rights of neutrality, it would be unbecoming in us to meddle in political matters, but this cannot prevent our condemnation of the deed against which our whole natures rise in revolt. We believe that nothing can justify assassination, still less the murder of an old man in the bosom of his family.

At the same time he made the following address to the Legislature:— Messrs. President and Deputies! I have but one word and one sentiment in acknowledgment of the honor you have done me. My word is frank and loyal, my sentiment profound and heartfelt, and both are identified with the Constitution, in whose name I have overturned tyranny, for the good of the people.

Gen. Lopez Jordan has forwarded to the National Government the usual notification of his election in these words:— To His Ex. Dr. Velaz Sarsted, Minister of Interior.

Madame Urquiza with all her children arrived here on Saturday afternoon on board the steamer. Villa del Salto, and at once proceeded to the Hotel de la Paix, where they are now stopping.

Sunday was a wet and miserably gloomy day. At daybreak there was a short but violent thunderstorm, and a drizzling rain continued to fall throughout the day.

A lighted candle, on the high altar, fell during the ceremonies on Good Friday night in the church of San Nicolas. At first some alarm was created, but happily no damage was done.

Although Saturday was not a holiday there was no business done at any of the Government offices; from the Minister to the door porter all the employees were away, some praying, others "excursionizing," this was the situation!

We read in one of our colleagues that a share of one-third of the Tribuna newspaper has lately been sold for the large sum of two millions of paper dollars.

A thief entered a house near the San Miguel church on Sunday week with the intention of wholesale plunder, as the owner was absent and the place locked up. While roaming through the premises with a bunch of false keys in his hand, a thunderstorm came on and a flash of lightning fell in the patio, one of the doors in which he was at the moment trying to open.

The electric fluid struck the keys and reduced the man in a second to a corpse. The occurrence was not discovered till Saturday last, when on the return of the proprietor the body was found, the keys still clenched in the right hand.

A share in the Colon Theatre has lately, we hear, been sold for the sum of \$150,000 mps.

At the fire that took place on Good Friday in Sr. del Cobo's almaceen in Calle Tacuari at the corner of Calle Mexico, property to the value of fifty thousand dollars was destroyed.

Some of the parties arrested by order of the National authorities on the assassination of General Urquiza becoming known, have been liberated on condition of taking up their residence at a point in the interior of this province to be named by the Government.

Don Juan José Mendez intends taking out a patent for his new system of shipbuilding in the United States, as well as here and in Great Britain.

In the town of San Pedro in Paraguay, from twenty to thirty people are said to perish daily from starvation.

The exciting events of the last few days have probably so interested the Municipality, that that respectable body may be expected to be more than usually negligent of its duty till affairs settle down.

There is a frightful 'pantano' in Bond Street, at the corner of Piedad, which has been left to grow 'large by degrees' for the last ten days, and which must soon render the street impassable at this point.

At their earliest convenience we bespeak the attention of the civic authorities to this dangerous nuisance.

The Brazilian contingent to remain in Paraguay has been fixed at 7,000 men of all arms.

This institution, which is indispensable in a large town, here supersedes the omnibuses, and the hackney-coach is seldom seen.

All classes ride in the cars, from the wealthy merchant who makes his daily journey from his residence in the suburbs to his counting-house to the market girl and shop woman.

No smoking is allowed, and the conductors are generally polite and civil. Whether you go two squares or six miles the price is the same, six cents.

In nothing is the contrast greater than that between an American city and the great metropolis of the River Plate in the institution of street-cars—a contrast which it is to be hoped will not long exist.

At a future time, if these lines should interest you or your readers, I will give you some further sketches of my journey homeward.

We must confess that, despite the species of illumination that Captain Burton throws over the history of Paraguay and its rulers in his 'essay,' we cannot be expected to forget that the system of Government in that country was after all nothing more than a slavish despotism.

The 'essay' referred to introduces a series of letters, which Captain Burton has rendered most interesting.

They are written in his usual easy, but at the same time close style; and he carries one over the ground with wonderful facility.

He differs materially with Captain Burton as to the issues which have been raised by the Paraguayan war, and do not endorse his strictures upon the Triple Alliance.

We look upon the Triple Alliance as an event, which, under Providence, will contribute immensely to the development of the River Plate by consolidating the liberal institutions and removing the danger with which ambitious despotism in Paraguay menaced the respective states.

Paraguay in being taken away from Lopez, has been given to the world, and will doubtless now make progress in the paths of freedom and civilization.

Future generations and civilizations will date the advancement of that part of South America from the subjugation of one of its worst enemies—the ex-Dictator Lopez.

It is evident from Captain Burton's own admissions that Lopez had long had it in meditation to "spring" upon the territories of his neighbours.

His views of emigration in the R. Plate are somewhat singular, and we believe, erroneous; and we are convinced that his conclusions will be falsified in a manner which will prove gratifying to himself, confident as we are that he is desirous of the progress of the countries he has so well described.

THE SYSTEM OF POLICE. Gentleman: If we cannot expect an immediate cure of the evils arising from the clumsy systems of law and procedure existent, we can at least do something.

The system of police is simply such as to render efficiency impossible. There is no secure person, no house of correction, and the Chief of Police uses in his own prison the various offices of chief constable, Bridewell-keeper, and magistrate.

Such systems have faded out everywhere else, and the police elsewhere are purely executive and have nothing to do with administering justice.

Let a sitting magistrate be appointed who shall from 10 until 4— not from 11 until 3 as in the Custom-house—sit and hear 'viva voce' and publicly' all charges of the day, and punish the minor and remit the graver cases to higher courts to be tried within one week.

Appoint a chief constable who, after studying what his office is on European models, and importing a few officers from Paris and London, have the executive—and that only—confided to him.

Let secure prisons be built, and an intelligent governor be appointed to each. It is only such reforms that will bring matters into their proper position, and help to remove the stigma of 'impunity' from the administration.

The police court I propose would be attended by the short hand writers of the press, and you could thus each morning with your acknowledged accuracy furnish your readers with an account of the cases, sentences, and the names of the prisoners.
