Yard rushed to the garden. Gen. Urquiza made for his bed room, and took down a breech-loading rifle (six shots). Madame Urquiza seized two daggers, and the brave Lola her father's sword. All seemed to have an intuitive fear of what was about to follow, and that the object of the parties outside was to murder the Governor of Entre Rios; but all this was the work of a moment; the murderers, who saw Gen. Urquiza crossing the patio to his room, followed up, and entered as Madame Urquiza rushed out to call for aid. When they entered the room they fired a volley; one ball struck the General in the mouth, and he fell mortally wounded. Lola threw herself on the lifeless body of her father, fearing, as she says, that the assassins intended to cut his throat, and heroically shouted that they should kill her first; with her left arm around her father and her breast to shield him from further wounds, she brandished in her right hand the sword, and actually cut down one villain who approached. Then one Alvarez, Colonel, and Vera rushed forward, and under her waist they stabbed the General until life was perfectly extinct. The General expired in his daughter's arms. Justina (a girl of about 14) had no arms whatever; she threw herself also on the body of her father, braving the assassins, and calling on them to kill her, but she received the ball in a pillow, as also other balls which were fired on her from all quarters. Madame Urquiza, perceiving that the assassins were now masters of the house, the small guard outside having been surprised, returned to the room, where she found her husband murdered, and her two daughters embracing their father's corpse, which was bathed in blood; there was a smile on the lips of the dead General. The dresses of the heroic girls were covered with blood, as also the tresses of Lola. After the murder the assassins left for the outer court-yard. They entered some of the rooms, sacked them of all the money and valuables, and coming upon the mother of Mme. Urquiza, compelled the old lady to accompany them to a 'pulperia' which was at the portico of the palace; some of the fellows drank there to intoxication, but the leaders of the party kept going round the house in order to make sure that none were approaching. As soon as the murderers had retired from the room where they had killed Urquiza, Lola and Justina, fearing that they might return to kill their mother, ran to the large gate which shuts the inner court yard from the outer and made it fast; this done, they knelt around the corpse and passed the night in prayer. One of the smaller children Micaela, when she heard the first noise rushed out, and one of the assassins fired on her but she escaped. One of the murderers told Justina, that not a son of Urquiza's would escape, and that at that moment his sons in Concordia, were also assassinated. A few hours after the murder, the murderers returned, almost in the middle of the night, to see if General Urquiza was dead; the weeping daughters heaped every imprecation on the assassins of their father; one of the murderers attempted to stab the girls, but Alvarez stayed the assassins arm. Dr. Medrano, the General's secretary, at the first alarm escaped out and sent a 'chasque' to Concepcion for aid. At daybreak the assassins returned and tried to enter the inside court yard. The family seeing themselves alone, unprotected, and surrounded by the murderers, shut themselves up in the 'mirador' of the palace. The assassins called upon them to deliver up all the arms in the house; who could resist them? Everything was given up and that night Vera presented to his wife the sword of Urquiza, with which Lola so valiantly defended her father. What a trophy?

Madame Urquiza and her daughters came down from the mirador, when General Galarza and Teofilo Urquiza reached the palace from Uruguay. When they entered the house at one side, the assassins decamped at the other. The first care of the unfortunate family was to provide a coffin for the General; this done, the family started for Concepcion "escorting" themselves the corpse. A small picnic of infantry attended the town a slight scrimmage took place between these soldiers and some troops of Lopez Jordan. After a while the family was allowed to enter, the corpse was taken to the house of Anita Urquiza, the wife of Dr. Victoria; shortly afterwards it was taken to the church, and from thence to the cemetery. There was a very small attendance at the funeral, and only Dr. Zarco had the courage to deliver an oration over the General's grave, which was most affecting. This over, the family of the General went along to the mole unaccompanied by a single friend; they went on board a Spanish barque, which dropped down the stream and took them to the steamer Villa del Salto. On the arrival of the family at the mole-head in Buenos Ayres an immense concourse assembled to welcome them; they at once proceeded to the Hotel de la Paix, where they are at present stopping.

**THE LONDON TRAMWAYS.**  
Now that public opinion has decided that tramways shall be made, the question is being raised—Who shall make them? The surveyor of the parish of St. Pancras urges the parochial authorities to lay down tramways, themselves, and to let the companies merely provide for the traffic. Other suggestions contemplate not only the making, but the working of the tramways by municipal authority. The argument in favor of the suggestions, is that it is undesirable to admit any independent body to have power over the streets; that, in fact, the public streets should be kept exclusively in the hands of the public authorities. Unfortunately, the streets are even now in the hands of companies who are not interested in keeping them in order; and it may be said for the tramway companies that their use of the streets would depend on their being in good condition. In most of our London streets, it would be a good thing to have an energetic company keeping the gas and water companies on their good behavior. The local authorities pave the road, and soon after it is done the gas company peeks it up to mend an escape in its mains, and leaves a permanent hole in the new surface. A month or two later the gas company comes, the water company and makes a ditch, fills it up badly, and leaves a ditch of damage all along the road. Now, to the tramway companies a good road will be essential. They will not only keep in order their own expense, the part over which their carriages run, but will put a check on these other companies who are the natural enemies of paved streets. Nor is anything to be gained by making parochial and municipal authorities do the work which has always been entrusted to companies. In the supply of gas and water they can do well: these are matters in which there is no competition, and matters of prime necessity. But tramways compete with omnibuses and cabs and railways, and it would not be fair that this competition should be undertaken by parochial authorities. Our custom has been to leave such matters to private hands, and there is no occasion whatever for departing from it in the case of Tramways.—Daily News.

**THE DARIEN CANAL.**  
The United States steamer Nipac, Commander Selfridge, arrived at Aspinwall on the afternoon of the 9th inst., from New York, whence she sailed on the 22nd ult. The Nipac will sail again for Callonia Bay, the point from which it is proposed to commence the survey, and where the storeship Guardian will be awaiting her arrival. Captain Selfridge is at present in Panama. We hear that forty laborers have been contracted for at Portobello to assist in clearing the track.

States of America, and likewise to the commercial interests and the civilization of the world; and the United States of America have agreed to enter into a treaty for the purpose of facilitating and securing the great objects aforesaid, and to this end have appointed of their respective Plenipotentiaries, Messrs Justo Arosemena and Jacobo Sanchez, on the part of the United States of Colombia, and Stephen A. Hurlbut Esq., Minister Resident of the United States of America in the United States of Colombia, on the part of the United States of America, who, having exchanged their respective full powers, which they found to be in due form, have agreed upon the following:  
The United States of Colombia consent and agree that the cause to be made the necessary explorations to determine the practicability of said Canal; and the United States of America agree to make said explorations, and if they shall find the work is practicable, to form the respective practical plans with all their dependencies, including the necessary explorations, and other constructions whatsoever that may be necessary for the proper use thereof, on the land or the water, within the jurisdiction of the United States of Colombia; they will adopt a plan of construction and for the purpose in view form complete and minute estimates; and to that end
