

The South American Monthly was started in Rosario by the Rev. Mr. Carter, the American clergyman of that place, towards the close of the eventful year A.D. 1868. The proprietor and editor had, during years of pastoral service, observed (what perhaps the public did not) the great want of an English organ in that rising place; and what with the aid of religion and friendship a sufficient subscription was got together to cover the expense of publication; indeed, we believe that in the morning of its existence such was the sympathy and support which the budding organ received, that it was contemplated at first to publish The South American Monthly once a fortnight, But the heavy lexpenses attending this extra publication and the increased tax which it would impose upon the time and brains of the reverend editor defeated the project. The magazine came out mouthly and with a punctuality which spoke well for the editor and proprietor.

It is to be regretted that we have not preserved a file of the South American Monthly since its first issue, for, if we recollect aright, the interest of chain of amusing correspondence from some party in Santa Fé to his maternal was small but decently printed, well bound, and breathed that tone of evangelical sentiment so usual in what is called Tract literature.
