The Paraguayan forces in Corrientes were naked, and had only beef to eat: the means of transport were wanting, and Lopez meanwhile pressed Robles to make an advance.

Robles being prisoner, the deponent assumed the command of the forces in Peguahó, Colonel Alen remaining always as chief of the 'Etat Major.' On this occasion the forces amounted to 22,000 men of the three arms, and 30 guns: this constituted the army of the south.

Besides these forces there were 2,000 men in Humaitá, 5,000 in Cerro Leon, 4,000 in Asuncion, the capital, and from the village of Encarnacion Estigarribia had started with 10,000 men, still leaving forces at that point. From all quarters recruits were collected, so that in one year Lopez rais-


