

THE WAR.

A fight took place on Monday between the troops of the 'Red Prince' and the Army of the Loire; but it was not the great battle that we have all been expecting.

The decisive battle has, however, yet to be fought, and will probably be delayed until Prince Frederick Charles suddenly takes the initiative.

The French are strengthening their position at Orleans. They have been making earthworks to a considerable distance, beginning outside the town to the north.

A telegram from Versailles represents that General Werder succeeded in the operation mentioned yesterday as in preparation against the Garibaldi.

The presence of a Prussian detachment at Chateau-Renaud, sixteen miles from Tours, has caused some excitement in the latter city.

The authorities of Tours are not satisfied with the amount of local resistance which has been offered to the enemy.

Accounts from Boulogne, derived from fugitives from Amiens, state that the Mobiles behaved very badly on Sunday in the action before the latter city.

On Sunday night, when Boulogne was crowded, it being the end of the great fair, it became known that important news had arrived, and the whole population went to the Prefecture.
