





under General Flores. Lieut. Bidart received a bullet in the leg at the recent battle of Sance, but the physicians could not find it and he seems to have died of mortification. His widowed mother is left in poverty. It is truly pitiable what suffering and loss of life this war entails.

The Ariadne has brought no confirmation of the rumor that the garrison of Paris had broken through the German lines. The statements of passengers are unreliable. Respecting the ill-fated Borneo it seems Capt. Cole, Mrs. Walker and others are among the survivors.

Camp news has arrived to the effect that a battle took place on the 3rd at San Salvador between Major Galarza's force and a body of 150 Blancos under Romero: the latter were routed, with the loss of their leader and 3 men. At Colonia there was an alarm on Tuesday of 100 Blancos under Monico Martinez besieging the town, but it turned out his force did not exceed 10 men.

Dr. William Nathaniel Hyron and Mr. John Peacock, of the London school of medicine, have passed their examination favorably, the former as a physician, the latter an apothecary. Messrs. Yarrow have invited a number of friends to lunch aboard the John Elder, which is expected in port on Tuesday, with dates from Lisbon to the 19th. Dec. She is a magnificent, new vessel.

The Tribune says a courier has been intercepted with a letter from Aparicio to Lopez Jordan, asking for a reinforcement of 1500 cavalry. The Telegraph repeats the rumor of proposals being again laid before the Government with the view of making terms with the Blancos. Major Courtin started last night with 200 horse to join Goyo Suarez.

General Livras arrived yesterday from Buenos Ayres, and is going to settle down again here, in his native country. Colonel Caraballo has come down from Paysandu. It is rumored that General Lucas Moreno has died of gangrene at the estancia of his friend, Calamet: it is probably a 'boha'. Colonel Fidelis is reported at the Queguay with 800 Colorado.

Everyone expecting the La Plata with dates to Dec. 9th. EDITOR'S TABLE. The Royal Mail steamer La Plata arrived at Montevideo yesterday morning, and at eleven o'clock we received from Mr. Stand-by O'Gorman a telegraphic despatch with the leading items of the news from Europe. It is fair to our invincible 'Special' in the sister city to state that our bulletin was at the service of the public long before our colleagues knew even of the arrival of the steamer.

The Gong beat the Rockets by fully an hour. The news brought by the La Plata is of the most signal importance. The German armies on French soil continue their victorious career, and although no great battle has been won, except that by the Duke of Mecklenburg's corps d'armee, the recapture of Orleans, the threatening of Havre and Dieppe, and the removal of the Tours Government to Bordeaux afford ample evidence that the cause of France never looked more desperate. The most important news for the English residents here is that a Conference has been agreed for the settlement of the Black Sea Question. The excitement caused when we published our telegraphic advices yesterday morning baffles description. The anxiety of the public was almost painful to witness; At a rough guess over 5000 people poured into our 'patio' within an hour after the first peal of the gong was heard. We worked off for hours three copies at a time of the bulletin, and yet the demand kept pace with the supply. We expect further news to-day, to the 19th ult., by the John Elder of the Pacific line.

Some survivors of the wreck of the Borneo reached here yesterday in the Ariadne, amongst them the chief Engineer of the ill fated vessel. Mrs. Walker, wife of Mr. Walker the English broker, also arrived; her children and sister Miss Lewis, also Mr. Butler manager of the line, unalteredly perished. Captain Cole was saved. In another column will be found a full description of this awful catastrophe which has so shocked the entire community of this city.

The following list of the number of papers published in foreign languages in New York may interest our readers. There are five German, two French, three Spanish, two Swedish, one Italian, and one Portuguese paper published in this great city, and the circulation of most them increases steadily in consequence of the enormous immigration ever going on.

The heat yesterday was very oppressive, the thermometer marking 91. Owing to the excitement of the European news, that caused by the sad details of the loss of the Borneo, and the rush of the foreign and native population to our office for the latest intelligence, our Indian screens could not be worked efficiently, and we feel certain we would have sunk under our accumulated responsibilities but for the consignment of Hesperidina and Youngers 'Pala' which we received last week as New Year's Gifts from sympathizing friends. Several promised cases of champagne have seemingly gone astray, and with the John Elder hourly expected the case looks serious, as the cellar can be just now described by the letters, M. T. While writing this we are happy to see some sign of rain in the heavens. This may save the situation.

Accounts from Montevideo announce the arrival of General Rivas in that city. He is still spoken of for the War portfolio. The peace party in the sister city is renewing its efforts with the Government to bring about a cessation of the war. There are, however, two sides to every bargain, and Jim Aparicio must also be consulted, for he is still at the head of no contemptible force.

The raffle of Old Warden takes place to-morrow at 4 p.m. at Watson's Casino (up stairs), and all interested parties should not fail to attend. We believe there are two or three numbers not taken, which, if not filled up before the time, will in all probability be raffled for.

Mr. Bateman, C.E., has finished the surveys of the river and port, and his report is finished and will shortly be presented to the National Government, which will, of course, order its immediate publication. This paper, emanating from such high authority, will be eagerly looked for by the public. The work of compiling the information necessary for such a report, and the personal labor required to verify it, have been got through in a wonderfully short time by this eminent hydraulic engineer. We have reason to think that Mr. Bateman's report will disclose entirely new views of the capabilities of our river, and the results we may hope to attain by the construction of a port. It may be interesting to our readers to know that Mr. Bateman's researches show Buenos Ayres to enjoy at present a rapidly increasing trade equal to one-sixth that of Liverpool, and fully half that of Glasgow. Mr. Bateman returns to England on the 16th in the La Plata.

We find that Dr. Hyman and Mr. J. Peacock have been admitted to practice by the Medical Board of Montevideo, the former as M.D., the latter as apothecary. Both gentlemen belong to the London School of Medicine. The Pariah, Captain Milne, sailed from Montevideo on Friday for the W. Indies, with a full cargo of mules. Captain Milne took his ship in aid out of the harbour without a pilot, and reports that no commander who had been once there need fear to do so, so easy is the navigation. The Pariah sailed further in this time than any vessel of her size has yet succeeded in doing.

Our friend Colonel Thompson of Paraguayan celebrity has obtained the contract for repairing the Pilar Church at Cordoba. We are happy to note the complete recovery of our colleague Buena of the Telegraph, who resumed his editorial harness on Wednesday last. From Cordoba we hear that a splendid new fountain will shortly be erected in the Plaza there. Prof. Gould's Observatory is progressing very fast. Last week the Bishop of Salta passed through the city on his return to his diocese from Rome.

We understand the cattle plague has lately developed itself to an alarming degree at Alta Gracia, in the province of Cordoba. Mr. Hopkins' two fine mares (in foal), which are advertised for sale, can now be seen at the veterinary establishment of Messrs. Wilkes and Douglas, where they were sent yesterday from their country quarters. The animals are in splendid condition.

A camp fire occurred near the Glew Station, Southern R.R., on Friday, which was happily extinguished before any extensive damage was done. As the train from Chascomus arrived at the Glew Station at 11 o'clock the alarm was given. The station master displayed on the instant an amount of energy and forethought that was crowned with the best results. He had the engine detached from the train, summoned all the peons and volunteers he could find of every rank, and despatched them at once to the scene of danger. Three times the engine returned with a supply of water; in it hides were steeped, and the fire there-with extinguished. The gentleman who supplies us with this information says that no praise is too high for the station master and the guard of the train. But for their exertions a splen-

did flock of sheep would have been destroyed. Notwithstanding the delay, the train reached the Constitucion terminus only ten minutes behind time. We call attention to a new bazaar, which will be opened to-morrow by Sr. Amaretti at Nos. 107 and 109 Calle Cangallo. It is called La Nueva Roma, and is furnished with an excellent collection of novelties of all kinds.

Our colleague La Prensa has commenced an action for damages, laid at 5000 patacos, against the Montevideo Telegraph Company for delay in the transmission of a telegram delivered in proper form at Montevideo. We understand that the despatch was delivered here within an hour of its reception at the office in Montevideo; owing to the number of messages it could not be forwarded sooner. Our colleague is not likely to succeed, if this version of the case can be proved, as an hour is a very short delay when there is a press of business.

It turns out that the plague that is raging in Asuncion is not yellow fever, but a gastric form of disease. The proportion of those attacked is very great, but on the other hand few die. The mortality in Asuncion from the fever has not been great, though almost every second person has been attacked.

CORDOBA EXHIBITION WATERWORKS. To the Editors of THE STANDARD, Gentlemen. Mr. Dawney in his letter has the goodness to state that he made a total alteration of the original plan, suppressing some fountains, especially one on the island in the lake, and putting in others in places where they were omitted. This is again untrue.

1. The fountain on the island was suppressed by Mr. Olivera to give place for a small kiosk, and not one of the others was moved, nor was a single one added. Again Mr. Dawney says something about hydrants and bill-cocks. If he has my plan he will see they are marked in five or six places for watering the plants, and for the palace.

2. With regard to the men and their instructions I refer Mr. Dawney to the Comisario General to state whether what I have said is correct or not, and may add that the only two big fountains were erected by carpenters who, perhaps, received orders by telegraph from Mr. Dawney.

3. I most positively deny having ever sent any letter or telegram to Buenos Ayres during the progress of the work, except in the form of a simple requisition.

4. I never said I had anything to do with the ordering of the engines, pump, &c. from England.

5. The tracing sent from Buenos Aires bears the name of C. Dawney, C.E. May I ask Mr. Dawney if he has a legitimate right to the appendage? 6. The piping asked for by me was 1050 metres. Mr. Dawney reduced this to 830 metres. If this is 50 per cent, the C.E. should study arithmetic. The advantages of this are as follows:—

Firstly. In case of fire in the pavilion there is no water. Secondly. The N.W., S.W., and N.E. corners of the quinta have no water for the plants, unless a hose of 100 metres in length is used. Thirdly. Three fountains, four bib-cocks, and the café supply come from one 30 pipe; consequently the fountains do not play well when the garden is being watered.

The arrival of the La Plata was telegraphed to the Standard Office at noon. Her news was of course the chief topic, and astonished the French and those who believed in the news per Araucania. The La Plata has brought out 2,500,000 in gold for the Buenos Ayres Government. There was no news about the Argentine Loan, but the news of the taking of Havana was confirmed.

The full particulars of the loss of the Borneo were supplied to-day by Mr. White, chief engineer of the unfortunata ship. Mr. White requests us to state that nothing could exceed the kindness and attention which the survivors of the wreck received from the Brazilian authorities. Mr. White leaves for Europe per next Chilean steamer. Vessel and cargo were fully insured. The probability, it was said on 'Change' had a policy for 9,000 patacos on the cargo.

The National Government now publishes daily the movement of the Treasury, which is important. On the 3rd inst. the Treasury had on hand \$347,875 ftas., and it paid out on the same day \$163,412 ftas., leaving a balance on hand of \$184,463 ftas. In the payments were noted:—

Mr. James Oliver and A. Lessaga have been named assistant custom's clerks in Rosario, and J. G. Escalera the new vista. The movement in the Custom House of Buenos Ayres on 3rd inst. was as follows:—

Duties on imports—Cash, 14,592 patacos. 43 cts. and \$71,679 mps., besides 19,293 on lotras. Duties on exports—Cash, \$478 patacos. 41 cts. and 2,898 mps. Bents for deposits, 7,416 mps.—all which amounts were at once handed over to the Nat. Treasury.

We understand that Mr. Rom is so anxious to have the place speedily built on that he has some 'quadrants' to dispose of in lots, which he will sell at one-fourth cash, the rest in payments at 6, 9, and 12 months. The best lots sold on Friday were those of Watson and F. W. Moore; the former was offered, soon after, \$5,000 for his bargain.
