





Yesterday in this column, is that of Mr. Oldendorf, with whom the animals have been for three years. There is no higher authority to be had in the country.

Mr. Saturnino Unzué has purchased from Mr. Leesmith his imported carting stallion Tom of Lincoln, for his estancia near Mercedes, where he has some good half bred Clydesdale mares, which are sure to throw valuable stock to the above horse.

A gang of highwaymen lately stopped a train on the Pacific Railway through the States, plundering the passengers and the luggage. A few days afterwards they were all captured.

It is subject of remark with all and belief with some, that when a fire occurs in a great city it must be followed by other catastrophes of the same kind. On yesterday week we had the blaze in Calle Peru, on Saturday the church of San Cristobal caught fire, all the altar decorations being consumed, and on Sunday we had the flare up near our office when the 'boot and shoe loan' was so successfully placed: Let us hope we are done with fires for a time.

Advices from the States by La Plata mention a rumour current in New York of the approaching annexation of the island of Santo Domingo to Prussia.

Great amusement has been caused on 'Change for some days past by the application of the cognomen 'Von der Tann' to a well known Teutonic broker, whose resemblance to the Bavarian General is said to be striking, though we confess we cannot see it, but it is hard to judge from a 'photo.' General Von der Tann No. 2 takes the joke in very good part, in fact seems to like it.

We heard a rumour yesterday to the effect that what we may call the Democratic party here intend purchasing the Coliseum, which will be used as their headquarters during the next election for Governor. The building will be called Tammany Hall after the similar institution in New York.

The Banda Oriental is swarming with 'materos', said to be deserters from Aparicio's army. Two men were found murdered last week near Mr. Wandelstair's estancia.

Mr. Charles Birch Bean, editor of the Liverpool Albion, died in October last on board the Cordillera, while coming out here for the benefit of his health. He was only 44 years of age, and died from over-work. His father founded the paper thirty years ago. For many years his mother edited it in the ablest manner. She was the only 'editress' of a newspaper ever known in England.

Balfé, the celebrated composer, died worth only £6,000. He left all he had to his wife.

Her Majesty at Washington; and that authority be given for the settlement of these claims by the United States so that the Government shall have the ownership of the private claims, as well as the responsible control of all demands against Great Britain. It cannot be necessary to add that whenever Her Majesty's Government shall entertain a desire for a full and friendly adjustment of these claims the United States will enter upon their consideration with an earnest desire for a conclusion consistent with the sense of honour and dignity of both nations.

The course pursued by the Canadians towards the fishermen of the United States during the past season had not been marked by a friendly feeling. The President recounts the history of the negotiations and treaties on this subject, and says an irresponsible agent has exercised his authority in an unfriendly way. Vessels have been seized without notice, in violation of the custom previously prevailing, and been taken into colonial ports, their voyages broken up, and the vessels conveyed. There is reason to believe this unfriendly and vexatious treatment was designed to bear heavily upon the United States' fishermen, with a view to a political effect upon this Government. The Canadian statutes assume still broader and more untenable jurisdiction over United States' vessels; they authorize officers or other persons to bring vessels hovering within three marine miles of Canadian shore into port, search the cargo, and examine the master on oath, and inflict heavy penalties if true answers are not given. The President recapitulates another Canadian statute on the subject, decreeing the forfeiture of vessels. It is not known, he says, that any condemnations have been made under this statute. Should the Canadian authorities attempt enforcing it, it will become the President's duty to take such steps as may be necessary to protect the rights of American citizens. The Canadian laws deny American fishing vessels access to their ports, except for supplies, and then compel departure in 24 hours. No seizure is known to have been made under this law, but so far as a claim for its enforcement is grounded on an alleged construction of the Convention of 1818, it cannot be acquiesced in by the United States, and it is hoped it will not be insisted on by Her Majesty's Government. During the conferences preceding the negotiation of this Convention the British Commissioners proposed to expressly exclude the fishermen of the United States from the privilege of carrying on trade with any Canadian subjects residing within limits assigned for their use, and also that it should not be lawful for vessels of the United States engaged in such fishery to have on board any articles, excepting articles necessary for their fishing voyages, and that vessels contravening these regulations would be seized and confiscated. This proposition, identical with the construction now put upon the language of the Convention was emphatically rejected by the American Commissioners, and thereupon was abandoned by the British. Plenipotentiaries; and Article 1, as it now stands in the Convention, was substituted. If, however, it be said this is founded on colonial statutes, and not on the Convention, this Government cannot but regard it as unfriendly, and in contravention of the spirit, if not of the letter, of the Treaty, for the faithful execution of which the Imperial British Government is alone responsible.

In anticipation that an attempt may be made by the Canadian authorities in the coming season to repeat their unneighborly acts towards our fishermen, I recommend Congress to confer on the Executive power to suspend by proclamation the laws now in force authorizing the transit of goods in bond across the territory of the United States to Canada; and further, should such an extreme measure become necessary, to suspend the operation of any laws whereby Canada vessels are permitted to enter the waters of the United States. A like unfriendly disposition has been manifested by the Canadian maintenance of the claim of a right to exclude citizens of the United States from the St. Lawrence river. This stream is a natural outlet of the commerce of the United States, and the President argues at length against the Canadian right to close it to such commerce. He cites the Rhine, the Danube, and other rivers whose navigation has been declared free. He hopes the British Government will see the justice of abandoning the narrow and inconsistent claim to which her Canadian Provinces have urged her adherence.

The President refers to the depressed commerce, and thinks that hereafter we shall have to look to countries south of the United States for its revival. He recommends Government to encourage the construction of iron vessels, and also encourage other branches of shipbuilding.

The remainder of the Message refers exclusively to domestic affairs.—Times.

THE SEIZURE OF THE FRIEND.

The above affair has caused a little sensation both in the States and England.

We take the following from a London contemporary: General Butler has had his wish.—He has been urging his countrymen to violate the laws which both England and America have agreed to impose on the fisheries. An American vessel has been found fishing in the waters

which are reserved by treaty for fishermen who are British subjects, and has been seized accordingly by a British steamer.

The schooner Friend, which was caught in this unfriendly act, hails from Gloucester in Massachusetts, and Gloucester is the Congressional district which General Butler represents at the Capitol.

It is difficult to avoid the conclusion that some of his supporters have been listening to his advice, and have got into trouble in consequence. General Butler's object in giving that advice was avowed. He wants to embroil the two countries. He is one of those political treachants who are only happy when they see their own importance reflected in the light of some tremendous conflagration. But though the captain and crew of the Friend have been unwise enough to follow his advice, we are sure his countrymen in general will not follow it.

Their common sense will put down this attempt to excite ill blood, just as it has put down former attempts. It is, after all, on the good sense of both countries that we must rely to maintain our friendly relations. The crew of the Friend will not find themselves to be heroes. They must pay the penalty of their aggression; they have been found in our fishing ground with hostile intentions, and have been sent to prison. We do not apprehend that General Butler will succeed in making an international difficulty out of their lawful arrest. He might do so had he only ignorance to deal with, but the two peoples are politically instructed, and know how to deal with men whose object is to set them by the ears.—London Standard.

There was a very sharp fall in the Bond market to-day. Prices opened at 64 and closed at 61. For March 31, 28.50 at 64, and for January 31, 35.00 at 64; this was the extent of the business done before 2 o'clock. During after hours there were some sales effected, but at reduced rates. The market closed at 64 cash, and for the end of the month 64 also. The bears have obtained full control over the Bond market, and real bond holders have now commenced selling both for cash and on time, owing to the rumors about the purchase of steamers by the Government and their payment in National Bonds at 70. The Bond market may be said to be now without bottom, as the public, instead of investing in the security, is trying to get rid of it.

Exchange ruled to-day at 50. Some brokers report bill to date at 49, but the quotable market rate is 50. There was a good deal passed to-day but the amount is not stated.
