CUSTOMS RETURNS FOR 1869.

Although the year 1871 has already begun we only received yesterday the returns for 1869, which shows that the Customs officials take 12 months to tot up their books.

The returns for 1869 compared with 1868 stand thus:--

This shows a falling-off of 2 1/2 per cent in the imports, and an increase of 10 per cent in the exports; collectively an increase of 2 1/2 per cent in our trade.

This shows a fall of 8 per cent in wool; an increase of 44 per cent in tallow; and 25 per cent in hides.

THE BATTLE-FIELD OF SEDAN.

We are indebted to Chevalier Sedan Cranwell, who has just arrived out per John Elder, for the following interesting relics, picked up by him on the memorable battle-field of Sedan.

Four prisoners arrived in town yesterday, two of them charged with a brutal murder in the south. We note that the only mention made of the affair is that two persons charged with homicide have arrived. So long as there is so little attention paid to such matters we can hope for no criminal reform.

We find in a West Coast paper that President Melgarejo of Bolivia has invented a new name for political executions. Whenever H.E. wishes to put a political adversary out of the way, he orders the intended victim to be 'whitewashed,' which operation is performed by a sergeant's guard with 'villainous salpêtre' and lead, instead of the old system of a bucket, a brush, and a little lime.

The first fatal accident on the La-croze tramway line since it opened occurred on Tuesday. A boy begging for passes, jumped at the car, fell, and was instantly killed by the wheels passing over him. Until the son of a Governor, Deputy to Congress, General, or other influential personage is killed, it is clear the police will not give the companies effective assistance in enforcing the by-laws framed for the public protection. Poor Uriosto was the victim of his disregard of the rule "not to attempt to leave a carriage in motion," yet every day we see gentlemen attempting the feat on all the tramways.

We publish to-day another London Letter from our Special Correspondent in that city. It treats exclusively of the Russian question which, in view of the Conference, agreed to be held shortly in London, is every day acquiring greater importance in the eyes of the English people. It will be seen that our correspondent comes to the conclusion that sooner or later England must renew with the Northern Colossus the struggle so prematurely brought to a close in the Crimea; and he adds an opinion that the sooner we begin the better for us.

A shocking tramway accident terminating in the death of a respectable citizen occurred on the tramway line connected with the Northern Railway on Tuesday at one o'clock in the afternoon. At that hour Sr. Uriosto, who formerly kept an almacan at the corner of Calle Rivadavia and Plaza Victoria, reached the 25 de Mayo Station in the tramway cars from the Retiro. The unfortunate gentleman attempted to jump off, but missed his footing, and fell first against the wooden railing of the station, then under the wheels, which passed over both his legs, smashing them to pieces. He was immediately carried into the station, where Drs. Wilde and Zapata did everything that skill could devise to save his life. A short time afterwards he was removed to his house on a stretcher, but expired two hours after the occurrence of the accident. Señor Uriosto was returning from San Isidro where his wife and family are when he so prematurely and suddenly lost his life.

In a few days we hope to find spare time enough to get the articles in our museum into order, meantime, "the cry is still they come." Among the most recent, and not least interesting, are those brought by our special correspondent from Cordoba, the Exhibition Committee kindly allowing him to take samples of the chief provincial products. The wines from Mendoza were too perishable to survive the journey down. For the same reason the cigars from Salta, and the salt from Rioja have not reached us. We are, therefore, unable to describe their appearance, but our correspondent reports favorably on their flavor—the wine very pure and sweet, the cigars larger, but not so strong as the Paraguayan weed. The other samples—nuts and yerba from Corrientes, copper ore from Catamarca; gold and precious stones (like rubies) from the Sierras, and cotton from Salta—are very fine. The cotton, which is of a light brown color, grows wild in Salta, but this is not the plant in the cultivation of which Messrs. Palacios & Co have invested so much money. There is, besides, a strange plant indigenous to Salta. It is a species of tall, thin grass, like what Lopez used to make into paper to print his official organ. The natives twist it into a remarkably strong, but twine, resembling whipl cord. With a view to stimulate emulation in the provinces the Exhibition Committee offer a gold medal to the best represented province of the Confederation. The favored province of Salta bids fair to carry off the prize.

Mlle. Douvry, who has now for so long a time been one of the great attractions of the Alcazar, and has since her first appearance been so great a favorite with the public, takes her benefit to-morrow evening, previous to her leaving Buenos Ayres for Rio de Janeiro, her engagement coming to a close at the end of this month. The programme arranged by Mlle. Douvry to-morrow night would make of the performance an event worthy of special notice, but when coupled with the favor enjoyed by the fair artist in whose behalf it is given, there can be no doubt that the house will be too small to contain the large attendance that will crowd it. Boxes and seats are in the greatest demand, and no doubt will rise to a high premium before to-morrow evening. Among the attractions of the evening is to be given "On demande des Ingéluets," one of a class of light compositions which have given to the Palais Royal a peculiar reputation for witty and somewhat 'broad' views of social life.

A very interesting contribution to the Cordoba Exhibition has just been sent in by a gaucho native of that province. It is the figure of a horseman of the Pampas, cut from a single block of wood with the greatest delicacy and skill. The work was done with an ordinary penknife, and has attracted great attention. The celebrated mares Bonne and Belle are still on view at the veterinary establishment of Messrs. Wilkes and Douglas, the party who bought them at the late auction not having removed them. We recommend connoisseurs in horseflesh to have a look at them; they are beauties of their class. The report of Mr. Bateman, O. E., on the port question was published in the Verdad yesterday morning. We will publish a short 'precis' of it to-morrow. We are unable to do so to-day, owing to the time required to compile an article which appears this morning on the customs returns of this port for 1893, as compared with the previous year. The Prensa of Tuesday evening contained a complimentary article on the improved management of the Northern Railway. 'Franchement,' this is no more than Mr. Crabtree's due, for he has done wonders during the past year to meet the public convenience. It is pleasant to see the improved service on this line acknowledged, as, for a long time the public were prejudiced against it, owing to the magnifying of every trivial mishap on the line by part of the city press. We understand some fine new cars lately ordered from the States will soon be put on the Calle Cuyo tramway line to the Plaza Once.

There are very considerable improvements going on in Calle Cangallo in the square leading to the 'bajo.' The high pathway is being removed and the level altered. The change was very much needed; of all the streets leading from the beach Cangallo is the most unpleasant to ascend. During the remainder of the summer balls will be given by the members of the Flores Club every fortnight. A colleague announces that Mr. Bateman, C. E., has been entrusted with the drawing up of the plans for the drainage, sewage, and water works to be constructed in this city. We are unable to confirm this news, but know that Mr. Bateman consented to draw the plans and superintend the carrying out of said works for a sum of £75,000, a somewhat lower sum being offered him and refused. A rattle of a magnificent pair of carriage horses is announced for the 28th at Messrs Wilks and Douglas' veterinary establishment, tickets \$200 mpc. each. The horses can be seen from today at Messrs V. and D.'s; they are very fine animals, mestiza breed, and cost 7,000 dollars mpc. when two years old. The Board of Public Health states that in the pig killing establishments round the city but little or no precaution is taken to prevent diseased animals being slaughtered. This is a very dangerous state of things, as pig dealers cannot be expected to be over nice or scrupulous. The matter should be seen to at once. The poorer classes complain bitterly of the water carriers, who now charge a dollar a bucket for the muddy water they hawk about the streets. Before Sir John Coghlan or the 'aguas corrientes' were heard of, a bucket of water used to sell at four reals. These water carriers want looking after, and a fixed tariff should be laid down for this hot weather. From Montevideo the news is nil. There was a terrible mad dog hunt in Calle Zavala a few days ago. Four people were bitten before the animal could be killed. Peace is still spoken of as not improbable by those in the sister city who have good sources of information. The general public however, don't believe there is any chance of the temple of Janus closing for the present.

It is said that Mr. Coghlan has resigned his position as Directing Engineer of the Water Works. January 17th. The Minister of War has arrived from Salta, and is waiting for General Borjes to arrive from the Arroyo Negro; Borjes will be in town this evening. The Blanco prisoners arrived here yesterday. I cannot give you the number, but should say about fifty. Several cart-loads of Blanco prisoners also arrived, which I believe to be wounded, as they were sent to the hospital. I wished to get more information in regard to the battle, but found it impossible, as everyone in the Comandancia at present keeps his mouth closed, and no chasque's despatch is to be seen by the citizens; but if anything here turn up you may rest assured I will send you the first and most interesting information. The Minister of War has been well received, and the grand 'fetes' and dinners given him at the Hotel de la Paix were something surprising for Paysandú. Even Bustamante's reception here was not equal to that of Sor. Ordóñez.

IMPORTANT FROM HIGUERITAS Gentlemen, Yesterday one of those melancholy episodes attendant on the lawless state of the country, produced by civil war, occurred about three leagues from here. A young man about 19 years of age, a son of Doña Norberta Aisa, of the Agraclada, in order to avoid serv-

ing as a 'Guardia Nacional' went to the house of one of his acquaintances, Don Santiago Pastrana, to remain concealed. A young man named Antonio Diaz, who lived in the house, being a brother-in-law of Pastrana, took a 'tercerola' and shot Alza in the breast, who died instantly. When interrogated as to the cause of his act, he said he had no reason except the 'gusto de matarle.' However, if he had not felt convinced of impunity for his act, in the absence of all authority, it is not likely he would have so wantonly indulged his 'gusto de matar.'

During the past two months our town itself has been exceedingly quiet and free from all outrage, although parties of Blancos and Colorados constantly enter and leave. The drought with us continues with augmenting severity.

There was a decided reaction in the Bond market to-day; prices opened at 63 for cash, and closed at 64; 9000 sold. For January 31st there was a very large business done, opening with a sale of 100,000 Bonds at 64, and subsequent prices running up to 64 1/2, at which they closed. For March 31st 95,000 opening at 65, and closing at 65 1/2, after having touched 66 1/2 for February 28th 60,000 at 65 1/2. The total sales of the day 364,000 Bonds. The general reason assigned for the rise in the market was that the Government had thrown up one of the steamers, and a large Bond-holder, who sold out last week, has commenced buying back. The news from Entre Rios was also considered as favorable, and, upon the whole, there was a better feeling in the market; the bulls look confidently to a still further rise.

It was said on 'Change' that a party who recently fled from Chile having committed heavy defalcations there, to the extent of 700,000 pata, was on 'Change' to-day. Steps were at once taken to look him up, but he could not be found. The discount brokers report a very good demand for money, and first class bills done from 8 to 10 per cent. For other paper as high as 12 per cent. per annum is paid.

The manufacturer of Messrs. Luis Othaus and Co. in San Francisco de Limapu, in Chile, has sent a box of samples for the Cordoba Exhibition containing numerous articles of Chilean manufacture, chiefly ropes, &c. of the very best description. At a late hour it was announced with some authority that the advanced guard of Lopez Jordan had entered the Esqui'a in Corrientes. Not much reliance is placed on the levies opposed to the rebels.

Exchange is firmer, drawers at 60d. on London and 5 3/4 francs on Antwerp. Takers are short of ready money, thus for cash the rate may yet be higher. It seems that the Provincial Government are only awaiting the specifications that Mr. Bateman is preparing. It is at once commenced the port. The presumed cost will be about two million sterling. The publication in our commercial columns of 'pagaros' protested by the notary of the Provincial Bank has given rise to some extraordinary remarks in the 'Nacion,' and it would appear that the writer whoever he is, appears to be unaware of the fact that the legal notices at the protesting of said bills had already appeared in the 'Verdad,' 'Nacion,' and other papers. Our only motive in publishing the list in question was to ventilate a swindle which we had strong suspicions had been perpetrated on the Provincial Bank, inasmuch as there is probable cause for believing that if not all, at least the greater portion of the English names mentioned in the list are purely apocryphal, as no such parties are known to exist. Some months ago a similar list of protested bills appeared in the native papers, nearly all English names, and yet not a single one of those names was known in town or camp. Some of the creditors of the indorser of these bills applied to us to know why we did not publish the whole affair, exposing the transaction and giving the indorser's name; this we declined in the absence of any official authority from the Banks that were the victims of the fraud, nor have we departed from our rule. The list we published the other day gave no higher information than that afforded by the legal notice which appeared in the other papers. As to the non-publication of such matters in the English papers, the correspondent of the 'Nacion' has fallen into a grave error, all legal notices directed to parties whose residences are unknown have always to be published in the papers, and a claim or demand the instant that it comes before a court is matter for the public. In a community so small as this, it is not, however desirable always to give any great publicity to such matters, except for special causes; in the case in question, those special causes eminently exist, as the history of the transaction as far as we can gather is full, and in publishing the list in question, we called from the long string of notices of protests which appeared in the 'Verdad,' only those names which appeared to us to be apocryphal. There may possibly exist in the camp poor men answering to the names which figure on the list, but there is no evidence to show that those parties ever signed the bills in question, and hence the bills are forgeries. Upon the whole the public is a gainer by such matters being thoroughly ventilated, as bills of the same character might be offered to other banks. It is not sufficient for discounters to look to the indorser of what appears a sheepfarmers bill, it is now essential to enquire if any such sheepfarmers does really exist, and the remarks of the correspondent of the 'Nacion' are every way uncalled for.

The Hipparchus arrived at Montevideo this morning. She brings no further European news but English papers seven days later than received by the John Elder. The following telegram was received by the Foreign Club—"Hipparchus arrived with dates from Liverpool to 20th Dec., and from Rio to 13th inst. No further news. Sovereigns 10.250. Exchange on London 23 1/2 for bankers' bills." The newspapers will be up in the morning. She brings 1400 tons of cargo for Buenos Ayres.

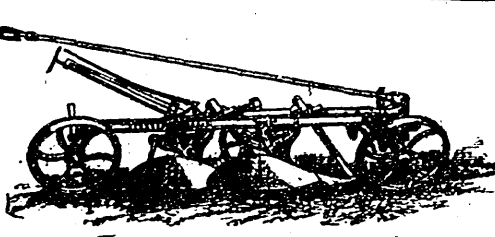
